President's Report

Volleyball Queensland (VQ) has enjoyed another successful year on the court and continues to build the foundation for growth in future years. Membership continued to grow by just under 5% in 2010. This is the third consecutive year of growth; that is a great achievement for not only VQ but for all of the affiliates. At a time when other states and territories in the Australian Volleyball Federation (AVF) are struggling to retain their membership we are the only member of the AVF to grow. Registered membership growth must be a key objective for all the organisations and groups that make up the Volleyball community. There was also an increase in the total number of VQ affiliates to eighteen. There are now affiliates from Torres Strait in the north down to Beach Club Volleyball on the Gold Coast.

Special thanks to the Queensland Government who has generously continued its strong support for Volleyball with a further three year commitment to providing funding of greater than \$200,000 in each of the next three years. This support allows VQ to pursue its strategic direction to provide more quality Volleyball opportunities to more communities throughout Queensland.

VQ is committed to assisting affiliates to build sustainable organisations that can successfully service the needs of their local Volleyball community. Toowoomba, which won the Volleyball Queensland award of "2010 Affiliate of the Year", provides a model for affiliates in major regional centres looking to develop such a sustainable organisation.

The four Schools Cup competitions are at, or near, full capacity. I wish to make particular mention of the Primary Schools Cup that has grown to 120 teams in 2010. This event is a result of a successful partnership between the Craigslea High School and VQ that has enabled the Primary Schools Cup to not only grow in total numbers but has provided these young people with a great introduction to the sport of Volleyball. The continued popularity of all these competitions and the successful athlete identification and development undertaken by the schools in Queensland, has laid a very solid foundation for the growth of our sport. The challenge for Volleyball Queensland and our affiliates is to engage these athletes, coaches and officials directly into our affiliates' clubs and competitions. Membership, as distinct from participation, is one of the key measures of success that is monitored by our government sponsors.

On the court, Queensland won the prestigious President's Cup at the 2010 Australian Junior Volleyball Championships for an unprecedented fifth year in a row. The President's Cup is awarded annually to the state with the highest aggregate result across all six divisions. Queensland won gold in four of these divisions: U/17 Women, U/19 Women, U/19 Men and U/21 Men; we also won bronze in the U/17 Men.

On behalf of the Board, I would like to sincerely thank the Volleyball Queensland staff for their dedication & commitment – Jon Gibbs, Sue Chapman, Kate Grills, Jenny Burton, Jill Kelly, Morgan Kunde and Harrison Clarke. The staff successfully delivered a range of services and events and have developed and implemented systems to improve the quality and consistency of these products.

Finally, I would like to thank my fellow Board members for their contribution and cooperation during the year. I would like to make special mention of both Brian Geck and Tamara Shepherd who resigned during 2010. Tamara brought a great deal of experience and knowledge from other sports and has resigned from the Board to continue her career in sports administration with the Australian Sports Commission. Brian has brought a strong business and regional focus to the Board and was a very valuable contributor to the strategic directions developed by the Board. We hope to work with Brian on special regional projects in the future.

I take this opportunity to also welcome Brett Richardson to the position of South East Queensland Director in November 2010. Brett is well known to the Volleyball community and in particular, the Beach Volleyball community. We look forward to working with Brett who brings a wealth of experience both as an athlete and a business man. Brett's skills and experience will benefit the development of both Beach and Indoor Volleyball throughout Queensland.

I acknowledge the significant support we continue to receive from the Queensland Government, the Australian Volleyball Federation, the Queensland Academy of Sport, Logan City Council and sponsors such as Mikasa and ADZ Impact promotional products. Volleyball Queensland continues to look for opportunities to work in partnership with our affiliates, clubs and schools to further expand the development of Volleyball and deliver services, activities and events in the coming year.

Treasurer's Report

This is my second annual report as VQ's Finance Director. We have built on last year's improvements through better planning and budgeting in 2010. Budgeting, whilst so important to the health of every organization, has been missing for some time in VQ and I congratulate Jon on completing a comprehensive series of budgets covering every aspect of our operations. The most notable reforms introduced in 2010 include:-

- full adoption of accruals accounting principles and practices;
- project accounting for all individual activities, including performance targets (participation and financial); and
- cashflow budgets developed and managed for our critical fourth Quarter.

We achieved our annual financial and participation targets for Membership, Schools Cup, State Teams and all other Development Programs. However, there were seven issues that impacted negatively on our 2010 financial result:-

1. \$21,937 in one-off expenses, including
 - a. \$10,494 transfer to AVF for QAS activities held in VQ's accounts for 2007-09;
 - b. \$4331 net cost to host Australia vs Canada men's international volleyball match on 24 June 2010;
 - c. \$815 in residual purchases of Entertainment Books intended for 2010 AJVC State Teams for fundraising activities;
 - d. \$800 payable to a third party for tents damaged whilst on loan to VQ for 2008 Queensland Open at Rainbow Bay;
 - e. Staff flex leave balances "paid out" prior to the start of the new award commencement on 30 June 2010;
2. \$5456 purchase of Mikasa volleyballs purchased at 20% discount on wholesale prices for retail sale to Affiliates. This discounted purchase will generate a good dividend in 2011.
3. Under-performance by our year-round leagues – Metro, Somerville House & West End;
4. Staff salary impact from the inaugural *National Sporting Organisations (Modern) Award*, which commenced on 1 July 2010, and which had not been factored into our pricing for VQ events in the second half of the year. The most significant changes impacted on overtime for staff working nights & weekends;
5. Membership carryovers. We carried over \$26,343 expenditure on 31/12/09 (for the first time) for memberships spanning into the next (2010) financial period.
6. Stock valuations. We have sold all out-dated stock at discounted prices through our Schools Cup events. The only outstanding stock issue is to sell our obsolete state team tracksuits and uniforms.

Treasurer's Report (cont.)

7. Breach of the West End Beach Volleyball 2010 management rights agreement by Todd Forrest. A number of membership forms and corresponding payments were not forwarded to VQ and a further \$4000 was foregone when VQ terminated the agreement a month early. The outstanding balance of \$17,442.13 is currently being pursued in the courts.

Overall, VQ has recorded a loss of \$17,658 in 2010. This is a disappointing result in light of all that was achieved this year. But we have cleared our books of a number of outstanding debts and previously-unresolved issues. We have gained better control and understanding of our cost-drivers, lead times and pricing mechanisms. We have fully transitioned to accrual accounting principles, project accounts and cashflow management. We remain solvent and capable of meeting all our financial commitments.

We have successfully renewed our prime funding grant with the Queensland Government to span the next three years (2011-13) commencing at \$215,000 + GST for 2011, to be indexed with CPI. This represents a \$30,000 annual reduction on our 2010 grant under the previous scheme which was a result of State Government policy. This means that VQ will need to increase its efficiency through cost savings and grow its revenue through non-grant related activities over the coming years.

I fully expect that with improved execution in our competitions area, and in particular through direct control of our West End Beach Volleyball Courts VQ will be able to achieve the modest surpluses which the Board targeted at the start of this rebuilding process.

General Manager's Report

This is my third year as General Manager at Volleyball Queensland. I was very pleased to maintain our full staff compliment throughout the year and I have been very impressed with their performance and innovation.

We set ourselves some very challenging targets this year for program enrolments and financial returns on all activities. *Weekly Leagues* (excluding PVL) was the only program that did not achieve its targets. We have since dedicated new resources to improve this program next year and we anticipate a significant improvement in profitability and membership as a result of these changes. In December 2010, we resumed the management rights to operate our West End beach volleyball facility after two years of contract management.

Further to the Finance Director's Report, I am disappointed by the \$17,658 loss recorded for 2010, but I am confident that we have addressed the contributing factors and we are on the path to profitability.

We continued to achieve near-record entries in our four (4) Schools Cup events, highlighted by new record 118 teams in Primary Schools Cup. We successfully lobbied AVF to make the "U/13 Spikezone" membership category free and then achieved 462 corresponding memberships arising from the 2010 Primary Schools Cup.

Membership grew by another 4.8% this year to 4132, as at 31 December 2010. We maintained our number of state-wide Affiliated Clubs & Associations at 18 (gaining three and losing three).

On the court, we sent five (5) state teams to compete at the U/15 National Championships in Albury NSW - achieving a Silver Medal (Boys Maroon) and two Bronze Medals (Central Qld Women, Boys White). We entered nine (9) state teams into the Australian Junior Volleyball Championships in Perth WA. We won four Gold Medals (U/21 Men, U/19 Women, U/19 Men Maroon, U/17 Women Maroon) and one Bronze Medal (U/17 Men Maroon). This culminated in Queensland winning the prestigious AJVC President's Cup for a record fifth year in a row. We also hosted the inaugural Queensland vs Victoria "*Interstate Challenge*" as a concept trial.

We successfully hosted *Australia vs Canada* international men's volleyball match on 24 June 2010 to a sell-out crowd of 1600 spectators at the magnificent Logan Metro Indoor Sports Centre. Australia won the match 3-0 and we subsequently won AVF's "2009/10 Event of the Year". We were also a finalist in the 2010 Logan City Sports Awards for this event.

We could not have achieved this growth and success without the support and contribution of our clubs, coaches, referees, administrators and course presenters. I would also like to express my gratitude to the VQ Board of Management for their continued leadership and promotion of Volleyball Queensland throughout our state.

Events & Competitions

International - Australia v Canada

Volleyball Queensland hosted an international men's indoor volleyball match, Australia vs Canada, as both teams entered their final preparations for the 2010 FIVB Men's Volleyball World Championships.

The match was conducted on Thursday 24 June 2010 in front of a capacity crowd of 1600 spectators at the new Logan Metro Indoor Sports Centre. Australia won the match 3-0 (25-22, 25-23, 25-22) and Volleyball Queensland was subsequently awarded AVF's "Event of the Year 2009/10".

This event could not have happened without the generous support and cooperation from Logan City Council, especially Karen Tattersall & Gary Campbell.

Interstate Challenge

The inaugural Interstate Challenge was conducted on 13-14 November 2010 between Queensland and Victoria. The matches were conducted at Clayfield College. The series attracted nearly 300 paying customers and was our first event web-streamed live. Unfortunately, Victoria won the series 4-0, but Queensland are keen to reverse this result in Melbourne in 2011.

Festival of Sails – Moreton Bay Regional Council

Moreton Bay Regional Council conducted its annual ***Festival of Sails*** community event at Suttons Beach, Redcliffe, on Good Friday 9 April 2010. We volunteered our staff time and equipment to set up a beach volleyball court for free use during the day.

World Refugee Day – Brisbane City Council

Brisbane City Council enlisted our support to conduct a grass volleyball competition as part of their World Refugee Day community festival for refugee groups and their supporters. The event was conducted at Annerley Reserve on Sunday 27 June 2010 and saw 16 teams representing their original homelands in Africa, Asia and the Middle East.

Senior/Junior Schools Cup

The 2010 Queensland Volleyball Schools Cup (Senior and Junior) tournaments were held once again in Toowoomba and Brisbane respectively. The Senior Tournament continues to grow with another record of 173 teams building on the record of 164 teams from 2009. The Junior Tournament continues to hover near the capacity mark, with 210 teams participating in 2010. Volleyball Queensland would like to thank all of the schools that took part in this year's Schools Cup Tournaments. We would also like to thank all of the volleyball community that helped in making 2010 Schools Cup tournament so successful.

Congratulations must go to Craigslea SHS for securing both Overall Champion Aggregate and Overall Champion Honours School for the second year in a row! Congratulations must also be extended to;

Premier Volleyball League

The Premier Volleyball League season for 2010 kicked off in April and ran for 17 weeks till early September. A total of 24 teams from 7 clubs across the 4 divisions battled it out over the season.

Future Stars Development Camps

In 2010 the Senior Future Stars Camp was held at Redlands College on the weekend of the 28 and 29 August. The Head Coaches for the Men's and Women's programs were Andrew McCaskill and Sonia Stamenkovic respectively, with thirteen team coaches involved with the athletes across both programs. Forty-three female athletes and seventy male athletes, ranging from 17 to 18 years old, attended the development camp.

Seventy-five female athletes and seventy-four male athletes attended the development camp. Sixty-six female athletes and sixty-four male athletes attended the development camp over the weekend.

Junior Pirates Camp
