#### **President's Report**

Volleyball Queensland (VQ) has enjoyed another successful year on and off the court in 2011 and continues to build the foundation for growth in future years. Membership continued to grow by just under 13% in 2011. This is now the fourth consecutive year of growth; that is a great achievement for not only VQ but for all of the affiliates. VQ is the only member of the AVF to grow in membership and participant numbers. Registered membership growth continues to be a key objective for all the organisations and groups that make up the Volleyball community.

Unfortunately, we lost three affiliates in 2011. Whilst this is disappointing for all of our affiliates, we all know the difficulties of running and sustaining volleyball associations and clubs. VQ is committed to assisting affiliates to build sustainable organisations that can successfully service the needs of their local Volleyball community. Toowoomba and Gympie, both former VQ Affiliates of the Year, provide different models for affiliates in regional centres looking to develop sustainable organisations. I encourage affiliates to share their experiences in the interests of all.

The Queensland Government continues to support VQ through its Organisation Development Program (ODP). We commenced a new three-year funding arrangement under their ODP 2011-13 program. Our organisation simply could not operate without the generous support of the Queensland Government, which continues to set the national benchmark.

Our Queensland Schools Cup series of four (4) events continued at record entry levels. Primary Schools Cup set another record enrolment of 143 teams. Our Junior & Senior Schools Cups continued to be the largest state events run by any state volleyball organisation.

The financial performance of our West End Beach Volleyball Facility was a great disappointment in 2011. The facility was destroyed by the Brisbane floods in January 2011. The facility was closed for four months, and re-opened with substantially fewer teams as we went into the colder off-peak season. The poor financial performance of West End had a significant impact on our financial result. VQ has worked hard to re-establish this key component in our activities and we are confident that we will again achieve profits from this facility. In 2011, VQ had an underlying operational surplus that has been achieved following a comprehensive review of all activities in 2010.

On the court, Queensland won five (5) aged-based national championship divisions in 2011:-

- 1. U/15 Boys at U/15 National Championships in Albury NSW
- 2. U/15 Girls at U/15 National Championships in Albury NSW
- 3. U/19 Women at Australian Junior Volleyball Championships in Adelaide SA
- 4. U/21 Women at Australian Junior Volleyball Championships in Adelaide SA
- 5. U/21 Men at Australian Junior Volleyball Championships in Adelaide SA

These results, when combined with our other teams achieving silver and bronze medals, resulted in Queensland being named "Champion State" at both of these national championships. This included a record sixth consecutive AJVC "President's Cup".



We welcomed two new members onto the VQ Board of Management this year – Barry "Baz" Wedmaier (North Queensland) and Jon Lamprecht (Brisbane). I would like to thank our outgoing Board member, Kent Scotney (Brisbane), for his invaluable contribution and support over many years.

On behalf of the Board, I would like to sincerely thank the Volleyball Queensland staff for their dedication & commitment – Jon Gibbs, Sue Chapman, Kate Grills, Jenny Burton, Jill Kelly and Morgan Kunde. The staff successfully delivered a range of services and events and have developed and implemented systems to improve the quality and consistency of these products. I take this opportunity to thank Kate Grills for her service to VQ and wish her well in her new career. I also welcome Matt Grinlaubs to VQ. Matt brings a wealth of experience to his new position in VQ and we are very fortunate to have him as one of our leaders.

We also successfully nominated two Queenslanders this year for Life Membership of the Australian Volleyball Federation – Peter McConnon and Russell Borgeaud.

I acknowledge the significant support we continue to receive from the Qld Government, the Australian Volleyball Federation, the Queensland Academy of Sport, the Logan City Council and sponsors such as Mikasa and ADZ Impact promotional products. Volleyball Queensland continues to look for opportunities to work in partnership with our affiliates, clubs and schools to further expand the development of Volleyball and deliver services, activities and events in the coming year.

#### **Finance Director's Report**

This year was the first period of reduced primary funding grant under the Queensland Government's 2011-13 Organisation Development Program (ODP). Under their new criteria, our recurrent annual funding was reduced by \$32,000 per annum. This required a complete efficiency review of all programs, pricing structures and our overall financial objectives. Our primary objective was to continue all viable programs without cutting staffing or impacting service levels. This review was completed in late-2010.

The start of 2011 saw the Brisbane floods impact directly and indirectly on two areas of our operations. Firstly, we cancelled two days (Wednesday & Thursday) of our Junior Pirates Camp at Boondall during the height of the floods, on the general recommendation by the government. This resulted in refunds to all participants, including a significant number who did not return for the final day of the camp. Secondly, our beach volleyball courts at Davies Park in Jane St, West End were flooded by the Brisbane River. We subsequently received a generous one-off \$52,000 grant under the Queensland Government's Flood Recovery (Infrastructure) Program to replace all the sand and court boundary lines. However, the facility was out of action for four months. Due to accrual accounting practices, despite the sand replacement being fully-funded by this one-off grant, our 2011 Financial Statements (page 1) record a "Loss on disposal of asset" totalling \$20,241.

Meanwhile, our financial systems and reporting have continued to improve throughout the year. We are now beyond the "paper losses" of 2009 & 2010 which were a direct result of our full transition to accrual accounting practices. Our 2011 Financial Statements demonstrate (page 9, note#8) that our "Income received in advance" has now stabilised around \$90,000, based on our current programs and activities. We again successfully operated with a weekly cash-flow budgeting system for the fourth quarter. We restructured our invoicing practices, further cleaned up our Debtors list, and fully incorporated our stock/inventory assets into our accounting system (MYOB). We are operating over 40 individual project accounts covering all competitions, programs & activities. Our various leagues (PVL, Metro, Spiker Sports) all improved their financial results, excluding West End Spiker Sports, which was in a re-building phase with its return to in-house operations. All other operations maintained their turnover and profit margins in line with budget expectations.

Following our December 2010 termination of Todd Forrest's contract management of our West End Beach volleyball Facility, we spent most of the year pursuing outstanding debts from Mr Forrest through the Queensland Civil & Administrative Tribunal (QCAT). This matter was finally resolved in November 2011 in our favour (including all direct costs), but it involved Volleyball Queensland writing-off nearly \$7200 (out of \$17,000) outstanding venue hire on top of the final month's cancelled invoice of \$4800. Overall, our West End facility has proven to be an enormous drain on our financial resources in 2011 and it has negatively impacted our financial result by over \$60,000 this year - \$20k "loss on disposal of asset" paper entry, \$32k operational result turnaround (\$16k annual surplus in several previous years replaced by \$16k operational loss), plus \$12k write-offs and withdrawn invoices to Todd Forrest for 2010-11 operations. We are confident that these large-scale problems are now behind us at West End.



The overall net result for 2011 is an \$18,107 deficit/loss, which leaves us with a very modest net equity of \$554. It is worth noting that this loss is greater than the \$20,241 "loss on disposal of asset" at West End alone. Indeed, this result comes as a direct result of the difficulties encountered at West End in 2011, notably flood damage, contract termination, and subsequent loss of customer base due to its four-month closure and predatory market competitors. Our customers have been returning throughout the year and we are confident that these numbers and our profitability will grow throughout 2012.

This overall 2011 net loss comes despite an underlying operational surplus/profit, excluding West End. The Board is confident that it has a strong grasp on our financial position and our ongoing solvency. It is also confident in our ability to deliver net surpluses in future years.

The Board has also submitted a proposal to the 2012 AGM to change our Membership Structure in line with AVF's membership definitions. This will result in lowering membership costs to most U/19 registered participants whilst simultaneously improving our financial result by \$19,000 annually. This proposal will be voted on by our Affiliates at the 2012 AGM and is the most direct way our Affiliates can help improve our financial position.

The Board has endorsed the 2012 Budget to deliver a \$25k surplus, which is at the upper end of our target annual range of \$15-\$25k annual surplus. If the AGM endorses the changed Membership Structure from 1 July 2012, then this will deliver an even larger surplus in 2012. Our published medium-term objective with the Queensland government is to achieve net equity of \$100,000 by 31 December 2013, which coincides with the end of their current ODP funding program. This would give our organisation the cash reserves to withstand similar natural disasters or short-term funding cuts in the future.

#### **General Manager's Report**

This is my fourth year as General Manager at Volleyball Queensland. We have had a number of key personnel changes during 2011, notably Sue Chapman commencing maternity leave in July and Matt Grinlaubs joining our team as her temporary replacement. Matt represented Australia at the 2000 Sydney Olympics in beach volleyball and we are very fortunate that our timing was perfect to secure his talents. Kate Grills stepped up to run the state team programs as well as the Schools Cup Series.

Our state team programs continued to be the national pace-setter and I was immensely proud of our teams' performances on their way to being crowned "Champion State" at an unprecedented three national championships this year - U/15 Nationals, Australian Junior Volleyball Championships (AJVC) and the Australian Junior Beach Volleyball Championships (AJBVC). Matt Grinlaubs established a new program in the second half of 2011 to enter a full state delegation into AJBVC, which was held on the Gold Coast, 16-18 January 2012. This new program will continue to grow in 2012-13.

Our in-house competition numbers all continued to operate near capacity and our total membership has grown for the fourth consecutive year. Queensland represents nearly 40% of the national membership of Volleyball Australia. Our state league competition, Premier Volleyball League, grew to eight Affiliated Clubs/Associations entering 29 teams. We are now actively pursuing venue options to expand this competition to include junior athletes.

The only disappointing operational result was the net annual deficit. This was a direct result of the Brisbane floods on our West End Beach Volleyball Facility, which was out of operation for four months (January to April 2012). We are confident that we will turn this around significantly in 2012 and return the facility to profitability. All our other programs and budget areas achieved their targets and we are confident of a solid profitable performance next year.

We have already commenced planning for two new state championship events next year – Queensland U/14 Club Championships (Caloundra, 9-11 June 2012) and the Queensland Senior State Championships (Cornubia, 29 Sept-1 Oct 2012). I anticipate several other state-level events commencing over the next 2-3 years across Queensland.

I would like to thank our generous sponsors who made this year possible – the Queensland Government, Mikasa volleyballs, ADZ Promotions and Logan City Council. I am also very grateful for the ongoing support and cooperation of Phil Muller at Queensland School Sport and Ron Mackay, Chairman of Queensland Schools Volleyball (QSV).

I would like to thank the VQ President, Mr Boris Georgieff, for his leadership and support. I also welcome two new members to the Board of Management – Barry Wedmaier & Jon Lamprecht.

Finally, I would like to thank my fantastic staff team – Kate Grills, Sue Chapman, Matt Grinlaubs, Jenny Chapman, Jill Kelly, Morgan Kunde and Alex Mainwaring. Sadly, Kate Grills announced her resignation in December 2011 to take on a great opportunity in NSW. Kate has made a huge impact in the professional delivery of our Schools Cup events in recent years and I thank her for her contribution. We wish her all the best.

#### **Events & Competitions**

#### **Beach Volleyball Flood Relief Tournament**

In May 2011, Volleyball Queensland partnered with Olympian and former QEDP Assistant Coach Angela "Gadge" Gaviglio (nee Clarke) to hold the 2011 Beach Volleyball Flood Relief Tournament. Many members of the volleyball community in Queensland were affected by the Flood Disaster which hit Brisbane, and in response to this the tournament was held to assist them.

With just over 40 teams that participated across the two-day tournament, we were able to raise over \$3000 to distribute to the affected members of the Volleyball Queensland community.

#### World Refugee Day – Brisbane City Council

Brisbane City Council enlisted our support to conduct a grass volleyball competition as part of their World Refugee Day community festival for refugee groups and their supporters. The event was conducted at Annerley Reserve on Sunday 26 June 2011 and saw 12 teams representing their original homelands in Africa, Asia and the Middle East.

#### Greater Public School (GPS) Volleyball

Volleyball Queensland renewed its formal agreement with the Greater Public School (GPS) Sports Association to provide qualified referees for its showcase matches during the GPS Volleyball season in School Term 1. This is the second year of the agreement and both parties will continue to build on opportunities to improve the standard of officiating throughout 2012 and 2013.



#### Senior/Junior Schools Cup

Once again, the 2011 Queensland Volleyball Schools Cup (Senior and Junior) tournaments were held in Toowoomba and Brisbane respectively. The Senior Tournament saw 160 teams competing across 66 schools, while the Junior Tournament saw 210 teams competing from 69 schools. Volleyball Queensland would like to thank all of the coaches and officials who put in their time and effort to make this year's tournaments happen!

This year also saw some fundamental changes to the Senior and Junior Competitions;

- An online nomination system was implemented for the submission of all nominations and team lists from the schools, very similar to the system used by Volleyball Australia for Australian Volleyball Schools Cup.
- The Youth Divisions for Junior Schools Cup were altered to include Division 1, 2 and 3, rather than an Honours division. This move was made to bring the Queensland competition in line with the Australia U14 Divisions, as well as to respond to feedback regarding the difficult nature of selecting Honours teams in a division where they had never competed at state level before.
- By-Law Changes were also made in the areas of Adult official, playing commitments for all teams and a Net Height Change to 215cm for the Youth Boys Divisions 1 team.

Congratulations must go to Craigslea SHS who made a clean sweep this year, taking home Champion Honours School and Champion Aggregate School for both the Junior and Senior Tournaments. This is the second year in a row that Craigslea have taken out the combined awards!

#### **Future Stars Development Camps**

With three separate Future Stars camps held in 2011, the camps aimed to recognise volleyball potential in our junior players and provide an opportunity for them to further their skills and be exposed to expert coaching. Athletes undergo a range of physiological assessments and performance benchmarking tests to establish height, weight, standing and spike reach, agility and general fitness levels, as well as participating in training drills and games.

**Senior Future Stars (U19)** – Held 27 - 28 August 2011 at Redlands College, this camp saw 21 male and 21 female athletes participate over the weekend with an 8-strong coaching staff. This year the camp was only targeted to 2012 U19 athletes to avoid duplication with the U17 camp.

Junior Future Stars (U15) – As the first of the Junior Camps, the U15's were invited out to Redlands College over the weekend of 12 - 13 November 2011. Spread evenly across the genders, there were 78 male and 78 female athletes that participated. It is important to note that this camp also doubles up as the initial trial session for the Queensland U15 State Team for 2012, and at the end of the camp squads of around 50 athletes were selected for both the men's and the women's teams.

**Junior Future Stars (U17)** – The following weekend, 19 - 20 November, our U17's participants also made their way to Redlands College. Our girl's numbers were at capacity with 80 athletes in attendance and another 72 for the boys.

#### **Junior Pirates Camp Indoor**

Each year, Volleyball Queensland holds this junior development camp in early January to introduce and develop the skills of our state's high school volleyball players. From beginners to trained athletes, the camp is a great opportunity for students to refine their techniques whilst having fun on the school holidays.

The 2011 camp was set to be one of the biggest we'd staged, with growth in participant numbers from previous years to approximately 190 students that had registered to attend. Unfortunately the camp was interrupted with the torrential rain which hit the South-East at the beginning of the year and ultimately led to the Queensland Flood Disaster. Originally planned to run Monday through to Friday, with Friday designated as a Beach Volleyball day, the camp ran only Indoor sessions on Monday, Tuesday and Friday but was cancelled both Wednesday and Thursday.

#### **Junior Pirates Camp Beach**

A new activity introduced in 2011, the Junior Beach Pirates Camp was specifically designed for athletes interested in playing Beach Volleyball. The three day holiday camp focused on teaching and refining basic Beach Volleyball skills and techniques as well as other areas related to sporting performance. Presenters included Olympic athletes and current national and state coaches and players. Leading into competitive opportunities, thirteen (13) male and female athletes participated in the camp which was held at the VQ Beach Volleyball Courts at Davies Park in West End.

#### Referee Courses

Throughout 2011 there were eleven (11) District level referee courses held throughout Queensland, resulting in 261 new accredited referees being added to the National Officials Accreditation Scheme (NOAS) database. In 2011 we also held the first beach volleyball referees course in Queensland in over 5 years, in July at the Caboolture Indoor Sports Centre.

#### **Coaching Courses**

In 2011 Volleyball Queensland delivered nine (9) GAQAP (Get Active Queensland Accreditation Program) courses throughout the state. These courses have produced 147 new accredited coaches from Queensland to add into the NCAS database (National Coaching Accreditation Scheme). At the end of 2011, there were 330 Level 1 coaches and 30 Level 2 coaches with current accreditation.

#### **Queensland Beach Volleyball Series**

The 2011/2012 Queensland Beach Volleyball Series (QBVS) was hosted at the Surfers Paradise foreshore by promoter, Beach Volleyball Gold Coast (BVGC). The series itself included 6 rounds, the QLD Junior Beach Championships, the 2012 QLD Open as well as the State Finals. Where it has been difficult to attract large crowds to Beach Volleyball events in recent times, the fantastic facilities at Surfers Paradise made it the right choice of venue in our attempt to make the competition more player and spectator friendly.

Led by Brett Richardson, BVGC introduced some new and exciting changes to the set-up of the series, including the introduction of a 2-day format for the AAA draws, as well as a day-night competition in Round 3. These changes helped increase spectator numbers and sponsorship for the series, resulting in a tremendous 5000-strong crowd at the State Finals.

This season saw a great emphasis placed on delivering a professional product that all levels and divisions of players could enjoy, and from the positive feedback that has been received since the conclusion of the series we believe we are well on the way to making ours the best State-level series in Australia.



### 1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial statement prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 of Queensland. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statement has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

#### (a) Revenue

Grant revenue is recognised in the income statement when it is controlled. When there are conditions attached to grant revenue relating to the use of those grants for specific purposes it is recognised in the balance sheet as a liability until such conditions are met or services provided.

Membership and Competition fee revenue is recognised when money is received.

## (b) Income Tax

The Association is exempt from Income Tax under the Income Tax Assessment Act.

### (c) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

### (d) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on the first in first out basis.

## (e) Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value as indicated less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation or impairment losses.

# (e) Property, Plant and Equipment continued

### **Depreciation**

The depreciable amount of all property plant and equipment is depreciated on a diminishing value basis over their useful lives commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

Office furniture and equipment	7.50 - 37.50%
Competition Equipment	30%
Furniture, Fixtures and Fittings	15%
Motor Vehicles	15%
Computer Equipment	10%

### (f) Leases

Leases of fixed assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the association are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised, recording an asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Leased assets are depreciated on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives where it is likely that the association will obtain ownership of the asset, or over the term of the lease. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for the period.

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

### (g) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

Cash flows are presented in the cash flow statement on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.

### 1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies continued

### (h) Unexpended Grants

The entity receives grant monies to fund projects either for contracted periods of time or for specific projects irrespective of the period of time required to complete those projects. It is the policy of the entity to treat grant monies as unexpended grants in the balance sheet where the entity is contractually obliged to provide the services in a subsequent financial period to when the grant is received or in the case of specific project grants where the project has not been completed.

# (i) New Accounting Standards for Application in Future Periods

The AASB has issued new, revised and amended standards and interpretations that have mandatory application dates for future reporting periods, which the association has not adopted early.

The application of those standards to the association has been reviewed and it has been assessed that they will not have any material impact to the association's financial statement.

The association does not anticipate early adoption of any of the reporting requirements included in these standards and does not expect these requirements to have any material effect on the association's financial statements.
