President's Report

Volleyball Queensland (VQ) achieved another year of positive growth in 2012. Our membership grew again this year by 15.2% to 5375 (up from 4661 in 2011). We have maintained fifteen (15) affiliated clubs/associations and we continued discussions with other volleyball groups with the goal of re-affiliating some of our former clubs and associations.

The Queensland Government continues to support VQ through its Organisation Development Program (ODP). We are in the middle year of the three-year funding arrangement under their ODP 2011-13 program. Our organisation simply could not operate without the generous support of the Queensland Government, which continues to set the national benchmark in supporting the sports industry and in particular, the community sport sector.

Our Queensland Schools Cup series of four (4) events continued at record entry levels. Our Junior & Senior Schools Cups continued to be the largest state events nationally, with Junior Schools Cup achieving a record 229 teams.

The financial performance of VQ continues to be a key focus for the VQ Board. While the bottom line for 2012 is a small three figure deficit, there continues to be strong growth in specific areas, in particular non-grant revenue with an 8.4% increase in 2012. The Board and the General Manager remain focused on improving the financial performance of VQ in order to provide a solid financial base for the further development of volleyball throughout Queensland.

On the court, Queensland performed well in all five national championships in 2012:

- 1st overall - Australian Junior Beach Volleyball Championships, Surfer's Paradise QLD (January 2012)
- 1st overall - U/15 National Championships, Albury NSW (April 2012)
- 3rd overall - Australian Junior Volleyball Championships, Melbourne VIC (July 2012)
- 1st overall - Women's Australian Volleyball League (WAVL), Various cities (July-August 2012)
- 2nd overall - Men's Australian Volleyball League (MAVL), various cities (October-December 2012)
- Queensland won its first ever Women's AVL national title in 2012, led by homegrown Caloundra star, Rachel Rourke (who was also selected in the AVL 2012 All Star Seven)
- Six Queenslanders represented Australia at the London 2012 Olympic Games - Natalie Cook, Andrew Grant, Tom Edgar, Adam White, Travis Passier, Lincoln Williams

On behalf of the Board, I would like to sincerely thank the Volleyball Queensland staff for their dedication & commitment – Jon Gibbs, Matt Grinlaubs, Sue Chapman, Jenny Burton, Jill Kelly, Alex Mainwaring, Kate Grills & Morgan Kunde. The staff successfully delivered a range of services and events and have developed and implemented systems to improve the quality and consistency of these products.

I would also like to thank my fellow Board members for their contribution and cooperation during the year. I would like to make special mention of Brett Richardson who retired from the Board in 2012. Brett brought a great deal of business experience and knowledge from his involvement with Beach Volleyball and elite sport. Brett continues to support the sport by leading the delivery of the growing Queensland Beach Volleyball Tour. As there were no nominations received for the vacant South East Queensland Board position at the AGM, the Board appointed Dr Stephanie Hanrahan to the position. Stephanie played USA college volleyball for UC Santa Barbara in the 1980's and then came to Australia to play for WA and then Queensland. She is currently an Associate Professor at the University of Queensland's School of Sports Psychology.

VQ conferred two new Life Memberships - Terry Rudder (Gladstone VA) and Brenden Turner (SD Volleyball) in 2012. VQ also conferred three new Distinguished Service Awards - Mark Norman (Toowoomba VA), Chris Hillman (Toowoomba VA) & Scott Humberstone (Gladstone VA).

I congratulate Gladstone Volleyball Association on being named as our 2012 Affiliate of the Year in response to their expanded committee, competitions and membership.

I acknowledge the significant support we continue to receive from the Qld government, Volleyball Australia, the Queensland Academy of Sport, the Logan City Council and sponsors such as Suzuki, Mikasa and ADZ Impact promotional products. Volleyball Queensland continues to look for opportunities to work in partnership with our affiliates, clubs and schools to further expand the development of Volleyball and deliver services, activities and events in the coming year.

Finance Director's Report

VQ has reformed its accounting practices over the past three years as part of a financial management objective set by the Board to realign recording of expenses and income into the year they are incurred or earned. This resulted in bringing forward expenses and deferring income causing deficits which would otherwise not have occurred. The Board felt it necessary to make these corrections in order to more accurately reflect the Association's financial position to our members. By the end of 2011 this process was completed and this year's accounts reflect a consistent presentation of VQ's finances in accordance with accrual accounting standards.

2012 overall has been a stronger financial performance for VQ. Some key items to note are:

- Gross revenue increased by 3.8% to \$1,238,512.
- Non-grant revenue increased by 8.4% to \$887,319.
- An unforeseen expense of \$5,000 was incurred as part of VQ's AJVC activity due to the collapse of Strategic Airlines which was booked to provide air travel for our players & referees.
- VQ's West End beach volleyball operation (which is no longer contracted out) has continued to struggle since the Brisbane floods, and was impacted by continuing poor weather in 1st quarter 2012 and direct competition from the previous contractor at another inner city venue.
- Strong surpluses by Premier League and Spiker Sports competitions.
- All other events have operated on a balanced budget.
- Debtor management was very successful with only \$1,374 written as bad debts.

The final result for 2012 is a deficit of \$974. Keeping in mind the Strategic Airlines loss, this presents a sound outcome.

VQ has further financial challenges ahead as our current Queensland Government grant agreement expires at the end of 2013. It is an uncertain period for all Queensland sporting organisations as we expect the Queensland Government may seek further budget savings through reductions to sports funding generally. It is important for VQ to seek further growth in our non-grant funding to ensure our service levels are sustainable.

The Board has set a target of achieving a \$5,000 to \$10,000 surplus for next year and all future years so that cash reserves can be accumulated and unforeseen expenses can be safely managed. VQ has over the last three years vastly improved its budgeting and reporting processes so that at the start of each year a comprehensive budget for every activity is presented to the Board and is closely monitored at every Board meeting.

I would like to personally congratulate Jon Gibbs for his diligent efforts in improving our record keeping. I am confident that with VQ's strong range of events and high participation levels, 2013 will be an even stronger financial performance for our organisation.

General Manager's Report

This is my fifth year as General Manager and I am very pleased to report that 2012 delivered growth in our revenue, membership, and affiliation. We achieved an improved financial result, despite several financial setbacks along the way. We struggled to establish two new events on our state calendar - the U/14 Queensland Club Championships in June 2012 were cancelled due to insufficient entries, and the Queensland Senior State Championships were run in October 2012 at a loss due to low entries. We have also struggled to expand the social beach volleyball competition at our leased facility at Davies Park, West End, since the Brisbane floods in January 2011.

We saw significant staff movements and turnover in 2012. Some of this was planned – Alex Mainwaring commencing university and Sue Chapman on maternity leave. However, we also lost some key staff as they took up new career opportunities – Kate Grills, Morgan Kunde and Matt Grinlaubs. We finished the year with two full-time recruitment actions pending and I look forward to building a new team in 2013.

We continued to refine and improve our financial systems within the constraints of a small business. All our weekly leagues improved their financial performance this year – PVL, Metro League, Spiker Sports (Beach and Indoor). However, we still have unmet capacity at Metro League and Spiker Sports West End. We achieved excellent results managing our debtors, creditors and cashflow this year. We have improved our stock control systems using MYOB. We will need to make provisions next year for increased spending on our ageing assets – VQ Van bought in 2008 and West End facilities established in 1999.

We were very proud to out-grow our venue for our Annual Awards Evening. In 2012, we moved to the larger-capacity Broncos Leagues Club in Red Hill and hosted 205 guests. We look forward to improving and expanding this event in 2013 to incorporate our previously-separate beach tour awards evening.

The biggest challenge facing our organisation next year will be negotiating our next three-year prime funding agreement for 2014-16 with the Queensland Government. We are also producing a new Strategic Plan to coincide with this funding cycle and we will be seeking input from our affiliates and other stakeholders. We look forward to showcasing our sport in 2013 to spectators, sponsors and government representatives through AVL, QBVT and domestic international events.

We simply could not deliver the range of programs, events and services without the generous support of our sponsors – Queensland Government, Mikasa, Suzuki, Logan City Council and ADZ Promotions.

Finally, I would like to thank the VQ President, Boris Georgieff, for his continued leadership and support.

Development

Junior Pirates Indoor Camp

Each year, Volleyball Queensland holds this junior development camp in early January to introduce and develop the skills of our state's high school volleyball players. From beginners to trained athletes, the camp is a great opportunity for students to refine their techniques whilst having fun on the school holidays. In 2012, 80 boys and 80 girls attended the four day camp. In previous years the Pirates Camp has included a beach volleyball day. This has been replaced by a Junior Pirates Beach Camp, held in October.



Junior Pirates Beach Camp

The Junior Beach Pirates Camp was specifically designed for athletes interested in playing Beach Volleyball. The three day holiday camp focused on teaching and refining basic Beach Volleyball skills and techniques as well as other areas related to sporting performance. Presenters included Olympic athletes and current national and state coaches and players. The camp is held in October during school holidays at VQ Beach Volleyball Courts in West End and leads into competitive opportunities. Being held for the second time in 2012, thirty one athletes participated in the camp



Future Stars Development Camps

Future Stars development camps are held to identify volleyball potential in our junior players and provide an opportunity for them to further their skills and be exposed to expert coaching. Athletes undergo a range of physiological assessments and performance benchmarking tests to establish height, weight, standing and spike reach, agility and general fitness levels, as well as participating in training drills and games. Two camps were held in 2012, with the aim of focusing on the U15 and U17 age groups of 2013.

Junior Future Stars (U15) – The first Future Stars camp for 2012 was held for the U15's over the weekend of 10 - 11 November. Invitations were sent out based on talent identification that had been carried out at Junior Schools Cup. The 50 male and 70 female athletes that participated were invited out to Redlands College. It is important to note that this camp also doubles up as the initial trial session for the Queensland U15 State Team for 2013, and at the end of the camp squads were selected for both the men's and the women's teams.

Junior Future Stars (U17) – The following weekend, 17 - 18 November, our U17's participants also made their way to Redlands College. Again, another 70 female athletes were in attendance and over 50 boys.

Referee Courses

Throughout 2012 there were ten District level referee courses held throughout Queensland, resulting in over 130 newly accredited referees being added to the National Officials Accreditation Scheme (NOAS) database.

Coaching Courses

In 2012 Volleyball Queensland delivered eight GAQAP (Get Active Queensland Accreditation Program) coaching courses throughout the state. In total, these courses have produced 136 new level 1 coaches from Queensland to add into the NCAS database (National Coaching Accreditation Scheme)

Queensland Schools Cups

Senior Schools Cup

In 2012, Queensland Volleyball Senior Schools Cup was held at 8 different venues across Toowoomba. The Senior Schools Cup tournament saw 182 teams from 78 schools across our state compete over three days.

Two new divisions were added to cope with the consistent growth that has been experienced over recent years. To accommodate this growth two new venues were used – Downlands College and Toowoomba Christian College. Once again this year, all match results were posted on-line and updated regularly throughout the competition.

In the Open Honours Division, Aldridge SHS boys beat Redlands College in the final, whilst the girls from Craigslea SHS beat strong competition from Gladstone SHS. The Senior Honours Division was won by Craigslea SHS boys and Nambour SHS girls team.

We are very grateful for the support of the Sport & Recreation Services team within the Queensland Government's Department of Communities. This tournament would not be possible without the support and involvement of Toowoomba Volleyball Association and Ron Mackay of Queensland School Volleyball.

Craigslea SHS was once again the strongest school in Queensland, beating Harristown to win both the Overall Champion School and Honours Champion School.



Junior Schools Cup

The 2012 Queensland Volleyball Junior Schools Cup was held again in Brisbane across 8 separate venues. The Junior Tournament saw 229 teams competing from 69 schools.

Managing the growth of the schools cup tournaments is always a consideration and in 2012 new divisions plus an extra competition venue were added. Four courts at Woodcrest State College hosted a very full weekend of volleyball. Volleyball Queensland would like to thank all the coaches and officials who put in their time and effort to make this year's tournament happen!



Craigslea SHS proved they are the school to beat in Queensland, taking home Champion Honours School and Champion Aggregate School for both the Junior and Senior Tournaments.

Beach Schools Cup

Beach Schools Cup was held on 14 & 15 September 2012, once again at Sandstorm Beach Club in Brisbane. Competition for both boys and girls included senior pairs, senior 4's and junior 4's. A total of 86 teams competed at the tournament, hailing from 22 different schools across Queensland.

Special thanks must go to all the Sandstorm team for their efforts in making the tournament work.



Primary Schools Cup

Primary Schools Cup was held at Craigslea State High School on Thursday 30th August 2012. Played under the rules of Spikezone on grass, the Primary Schools Cup is a valuable introduction to competitive volleyball for all students involved. Teams in the grade 7 Division 1 play a different format competition as games are held across three playing surfaces, including grass, indoor and beach courts. Volleyball Queensland would also like to thank Bruce Mann, staff and students from the Craigslea SHS Volleyball Academy for their invaluable assistance to make the tournament happen.

Congratulations to Woodridge State School who were the Champion School for 2012.

Beach Volleyball Competitions

Spiker Sports Beach Volleyball – West End

As an outdoor venue, Spiker Sports Beach Volleyball at West End experienced difficulty with the past wet summer. Season 3 is always the best attended of the year and the number of grades on Wednesdays has increased to cater for this. The pairs competition, played on Monday, does not seem as popular as it once was and Tuesdays are fairly stable across the year. Overall throughout the year there has been some growth in membership. This growth can be attributed to participants returning to the venue after its closure in 2011 due to the floods, and an undertaking to register players as members.

An “Open Day” continued to run fortnightly in 2012 to attract more players to the league. This proved to be a success and was extended to be a weekly occurrence during the 2012/2013 summer. The West End Competition Manager Jo Maddick has been integral in driving the growth of the league over the year and is assisted by Damian Stone.

Queensland Junior Beach Volleyball Championships

Held on Saturday 13th and Sunday 14th October 2012 on the Surfer’s Paradise foreshore at the Gold Coast, this event showcased the talents of the best Junior Beach players in the state. It was an important competition for the players with the winners of each of the divisions being given a spot in the Queensland team for the Australian Junior Beach Volleyball Championships, which were to be held later on in the 2012/2013 Season.

2012/2013 Queensland Beach Volleyball Tour

The 2012/2013 Queensland Beach Volleyball Tour (QBVT) was promoted for the third consecutive year by Beach Volleyball Gold Coast (BVGC). The tour itself included 6 rounds as well as the QLD Junior Beach Championships, 'King of the Beach', the 2013 QLD Open and the QBVT State Finals. The foreshore at Surfers Paradise made for a fantastic 'player and spectator friendly' venue for several events which included Round 4 being played as a day-night competition. The turbulent weather during the summer resulted with some events being postponed or moved to different venues. This year the tour was able to visit regional centres including holding rounds in Cairns, Mackay and Rockhampton.

Metro League

Metro League continued in 2012 with three successful seasons of competition. Spiker Sports Indoor Volleyball – Somerville House

Spiker Sports Indoor Volleyball at Somerville House has continued to grow as a very popular competition. In 2012 the competition experienced incredible growth as there were almost always more teams than game spots, especially in season 3 where 24 teams nominated. This has led to another venue being sourced for 2013 at Anglican Church Grammar School (Churchie) which will share with Metro. The venue manager is Sharon Williams, with assistance from Rudi Aioni and Tomika Peasley. With the added court space Spiker Sports at Somerville House and Churchie will be looking to increase its participation.

Premier Volleyball League

The Premier Volleyball League is the highest level of volleyball played on a weekly basis in South East Queensland. In 2012 the season began in April, and ran through a 14-round season. Semi-final and grand-final rounds for all four divisions were played in early September.
