President's Report

Volleyball Queensland (VQ) achieved yet another year of positive growth in 2013. Our membership grew by 8.1% to 5809 (up from 5375 in 2012). We were supported through 17 affiliated clubs/associations and we expect this number to continue growing in 2014.

The Queensland Government continues to support VQ through its Queensland Sport and Recreation Industry Development Program (QSRIDP). We secured a new three-year QSRIDP funding agreement for 2014-16 at a level similar to 2013, which is an excellent result in the current climate. Our organisation simply could not operate without the generous support of the Queensland Government, which continues to set the national benchmark in supporting the sports industry and in particular, the community sport sector.

Our Queensland Schools Cup series of four events continued at record entry levels. Junior Schools Cup and Senior Schools Cup both achieved record entries in 2013 with 233 and 190 team entries respectively.

The financial result was very pleasing, with a \$12,500 surplus achieved. The Board and the General Manager remain focused on a solid financial base to enable further development of volleyball throughout Queensland.

On the court, Queensland performed well in all five national championships in 2013:

- 3rd overall - Australian Junior Beach Volleyball Championships, Melbourne VIC (January 2013)
- 2nd overall - U15 National Championships, Albury NSW (April 2013)
- 1st overall - Australian Junior Volleyball Championships, Canberra ACT (July 2013)
- 4th - Women's Australian Volleyball League (WAVL) 2013
- 1st - Men's Australian Volleyball League (MAVL) 2013
- Queensland won its first ever Men's AVL national title in 2013, which followed our breakthrough win in the Women's AVL competition last year.

On behalf of the Board, I would like to sincerely thank the Volleyball Queensland staff for their dedication & commitment – Jon Gibbs, Damien Searle, Andrew Grant, Jenny Burton, Jill Kelly & Chloe Heselden.

I would also like to thank my fellow Board members for their contribution and cooperation during the year. I would like to make special mention of Jon Lamprecht, who completed a two-year term on the Board and championed the establishment of two Board Sub-Committees for schools and officials. Dr Stephanie Hanrahan established our Anti-Bullying and Harassment training program for all state team coaches and athletes in 2013.

I congratulate the winners of our annual awards:

Finally, I acknowledge the significant support we continue to receive from the Queensland Government, Volleyball Australia, Queensland Academy of Sport, Logan City Council and sponsors such as Suzuki, Mikasa and ADZ Impact. Volleyball Queensland continues to look for opportunities to work in partnership with our affiliates, clubs and schools to further expand the development of volleyball and deliver services, activities and events in the coming year.

Finance Director's Report

Volleyball Queensland's 2013 financial performance represents the culmination of five years of operational and financial management reforms implemented by the Board and General Manager, Jon Gibbs, to deliver two main objectives set by the Board:

1. a minimum annual surplus of \$5,000 to \$10,000; and
2. transparent, accurate financial recording.

In 2013, VQ's competitions all performed at or above budgeted outcomes. Jon has been uncompromising in his delivery of itemised budgets for every VQ activity so the Board is able to monitor the financial performance of each event. It is a tribute to Jon's diligence, personal ownership and hard work that he has been able to deliver to the Board such a comprehensive financial plan for the yearly events.

Some key outcomes comprising 2013's \$12,500 surplus include:

- Gross revenue up \$29,867 (2.4%) to \$1,268,379
- Non-grant revenue up \$87,456 (9.8%) to \$974,775
- Queensland Government Grant secured for next three years 2014-16 at same level as 2013
- Removed remaining unnecessary expenditure such as storage containers rental
- No unforeseen losses or write-offs
- Merchandise strategy implemented successfully to reduce stock held by VQ

In addition to noting Jon's outstanding leadership of VQ for the year I would also like to thank Damien Searle and Andrew Grant for the enthusiasm they have applied to their roles. Damien and Andrew have expanded the scope of our operations and improved the quality of our existing products. It is fantastic support to have two full-time champions for volleyball working beside Jon.

I would also like to thank Jenny Burton for her dedication as our contract bookkeeper over the past six years. Jenny has been instrumental in helping Jon reform our financial reporting. Jenny will be retiring in mid-2014 and she is assisting VQ train her replacement for an orderly transition. Thank you Jenny for your service.

One disputed receivable relates to a charge of \$3774 issued by VQ against Volleyball Australia in relation to the failed Digital Master Strategy. VQ through member capitations continues to fund VA for a long-promised and non-functioning on-line membership database and competition management platform. VQ will continue to pursue this dispute with Volleyball Australia.

VQ is in a solid position with high participation rates for all major VQ activities, an expanding base of events and a clear underlying cost base which has been closely scrutinised by Jon and the Board. I am confident for VQ's financial future and the Board's goal to accumulate consistent modest surpluses.

General Manager's Report

This is my sixth year as General Manager and I am very pleased to report that 2013 delivered strong growth in our revenue, membership, and affiliation. We achieved a surplus of \$12,500 and look forward to continued solid financial results in the future.

We successfully recruited two outstanding candidates into the VQ office – Damien Searle as Events Coordinator and Andrew Grant as our new Member Services Coordinator.

We won our first ever Men's AVL title in 2013 and regained the AJVC's President's Cup, making it seven times in eight years now. State Championships gained significant support from our affiliates this year and we look forward to this event moving to a larger venue next year (Boondall). We received official sanctioning from Volleyball Australia to enable Volleyball Queensland to establish and develop a new event – National Club Championships – which will be run at Easter annually.

All our weekly leagues improved their financial performance this year – PVL, Metro League, Spiker Sports (Beach and Indoor). We achieved significant reduction in our stock on hand at year's end, which was a very pleasing result and a credit to Damien and Andrew's fresh approach to inventory management.

Our 2013 VQ Annual Awards Evening at Broncos Leagues Club again attracted over 200 guests, which was held in conjunction with our State Championships tournament.

I am pleased to confirm that we have secured our primary funding grant for 2014-16 at levels similar to 2013, which is an excellent result in the current political and financial climate. We consulted our affiliates on the establishment of a new 2014-16 Strategic Plan to align with this funding cycle and work in parallel with Volleyball Australia's 2013-16 Strategic Plan, which runs through to the Rio 2016 Olympic Games.

We appreciate the support of our tremendous sponsors – Queensland Government, Mikasa, Suzuki, Logan City Council and ADZ Impact.

Finally, I would like to thank the VQ President, Boris Georgieff, for his continued leadership and support.

Events

Greater Public School Volleyball

Volleyball Queensland renewed its formal agreement with the Greater Public School (GPS) Sports Association to provide qualified referees for its showcase matches during the GPS Volleyball season. This is the fourth year of the agreement and both parties will continue to build on opportunities to improve the standard of officiating in school volleyball.

Fraser Coast Regional Beach Volleyball Invitational

In partnership with the Hervey Bay Boat Club, Volleyball Queensland hosted the first Fraser Coast Regional Beach Volleyball Invitational. The invitational, held in Hervey Bay on the 11 and 12 May, was a showcase event in which four men's and four women's pairs competed for a \$10,000 prize pool. All teams exhibited a high level of beach volleyball and friendliness over the weekend, including playing in a mixed four-a-side match and introducing children to the sport through hands on demonstrations. The inaugural winners of the event were Will Mercer and Mike Watson in the men's competition whilst Rebecca Matheson and Natasha Chaplin won the women's competition.



University of Oregon Exhibition Match

During their Australian tour the University of Oregon Ducks played a friendly international match against the Queensland Women's Team. The match was played on the 27 March at Brisbane Grammar School in front of a full house. The eager crowd included spectators travelling from regional areas such as Toowoomba and Kingaroy.



The match was a fantastic exhibition of the international competitive nature of volleyball. In the spirit of a friendly match, both teams agreed to play the maximum five sets before the game. The home team started strongly, surprising the strongly favoured University of Oregon in the first set, winning 25-22. From the second set onwards, the Ducks took control of the match, showing the crowd why they are the second ranked team in the tough NCAA American Collegiate competition.

2013 Annual Awards Evening

Development

Development Camps

Every year, Volleyball Queensland holds a number of development camps each aimed at different skills and ages of junior players. The camps are offered at various times of the year to complement relevant leagues and events.

Junior Pirates Camp is run in early January to introduce and develop the skills of our state's high school volleyball players. The camp is open to juniors of all skill levels, from beginners to trained athletes, and it is a great opportunity for students to refine their techniques whilst having fun on the school holidays. In 2013, 83 boys and 87 girls attended the four day camp.

Junior Beach Pirates Camp was specifically designed for athletes interested in playing beach volleyball. The camp is held in October during school holidays at VQ's beach volleyball courts in West End and leads into competitive opportunities. The three day holiday camp focused on teaching and refining basic beach volleyball skills and techniques as well as other areas related to sporting performance. Presenters included Olympic athletes and current national players. Attendance decreased in 2013, and after being held separately from the Junior Pirates Camp for three years, the camp's future will be evaluated.

Future Stars development camps are held in November with the purpose of identifying potential elite junior players and providing an opportunity for them to further their skills. Talent identification is carried out at Senior and Junior Schools Cup to find appropriate athletes. Two camps were held in 2013, focusing on the U15 and U17 age groups for the coming years. Athletes in both age groups undergo a range of physiological assessments and performance benchmarking tests to establish height, weight, standing and spike reach, agility and general fitness levels, as well as participating in training drills and games. The two camps held over consecutive weekends were attended by 159 girls and 98 boys.

Referee Courses

In 2013, Volleyball Queensland hosted thirteen district level referee courses in Brisbane, Toowoomba and Fraser Coast. As a direct result, over 230 new referees received accreditation at a district level. Volleyball Queensland also upgraded its accreditation database for both referees and coaches to better service these members in the future.

Coaching Courses

Volleyball Queensland delivered eleven level 1 volleyball coaching courses in 2013 in Brisbane, Toowoomba, Gold Coast, Sunshine Coast and Gympie. Many of these courses were facilitated in partnership with the Get Active Queensland Accreditation Program (GAQAP), which aims to provide skills and accreditations to teachers and people involved with schools and community groups. In total, these courses have produced 90 newly accredited level 1 coaches in Queensland.

Queensland Schools Cups

Senior Schools Cup

In 2013, Senior Schools Cup (SSC) was held on 2-4 August across eight different venues in Toowoomba. The three day tournament saw 190 teams competing from 78 schools across our state. Once again this year, all match results were posted on-line and updated regularly throughout the competition. This tournament would not be possible without the support and involvement of Toowoomba Volleyball Association and Ron Mackay of Queensland School Volleyball.

Craigslea SHS won both the Open Boys Honours and Open Girls Honours divisions beating St Laurence's College and Gladstone SHS respectively. The Senior Boys Honours division was won by Holland Park SHS whilst Benowa SHS won the Senior Girls Honours. Congratulations to Browns Plains SHS who was awarded the senior's event Champion Aggregate School trophy, which is based on results from all divisions. Congratulations also to Craigslea SHS who beat Browns Plains SHS as the senior's event Champion Honours School, which is based on results from the Honours divisions only.

Junior Schools Cup

Junior Schools Cup (JSC) was held on 18-20 October across eight separate venues in Brisbane's South. The JSC tournament has seen the number of entries remain steadily strong with 233 teams competing from 74 schools in 2013. A round of the Australian Volleyball League (AVL) between the Queensland Pirates and AIS was held as an exhibition match during JSC, for the school aged players to see the highest level of volleyball in Australia.

Craigslea SHS won the Junior Boys Honours division, whilst Nambour SHS beat Gladstone SHS in the Junior Girls Honour division. Browns Plains SHS showed their school's strength by winning both the Intermediate Boys Honours and Intermediate Girls Honours Divisions. In a reverse of the senior's event, Browns Plains SHS was awarded the junior's event Champion Honour School trophy and Craigslea SHS received the junior's event Champion Aggregate School trophy.

The Overall Champion Aggregate School and Overall Champion Honours School trophies are based on the combined results of the seniors and juniors events. Craigslea SHS continued their run by winning the Overall Champion Aggregate School for the fourth year in a row. Browns Plains SHS won the Overall Champion Honours School trophy, beating Craigslea SHS by the smallest of margins.

Primary Schools Cup

Primary Schools Cup was held at Craigslea SHS on Thursday, 29 August 2013. Played under the rules of Spikezone on grass, the Primary Schools Cup is a valuable introduction to competitive volleyball for all students involved. Teams in the first division of grade 7 played a different format competition as games were held across three playing surfaces, including grass, indoor and beach courts. Entries were strong again in 2013 with 146 teams competing from 21 schools. Volleyball Queensland would also like to thank Bruce Mann, staff and students from the Craigslea SHS Volleyball Academy for their invaluable assistance to bring the tournament to fruition.

Congratulations to Woodridge State School who were the Champion Primary School again in 2013, for the second year in a row.



Beach Volleyball Competitions

2013/2014 Queensland Beach Volleyball Tour

The Queensland Beach Volleyball Tour (QBVT) saw several changes for the 2013/2014 season. The Tour calendar consisted of ten regular rounds as well as the King/Queen of the Beach, Queensland Open and QBVT Finals. Various promoters were sanctioned to manage individual events whilst VQ ran the King/Queen of the Beach to start the season and oversaw the running of the Tour. The Tour comprised of events in the regional centres of Cairns, Townsville and Rockhampton with Round 4 in Mackay being cancelled at the promoter's request. Three day/night events were held in Surfer's Paradise, Mooloolaba and Brisbane due to the popularity of that format last year.

Australian Volleyball League

In 2013, the Australian Volleyball League (AVL) was successfully revamped into a stronger national league. Significant changes occurred to the league format in the lead up to the season including combining the men's and women's leagues which had been previously held at different times of the year, and moving the format to a pure home and away season with finals. The Queensland teams also had a new look, being rebranded as the Queensland Pirates with a new logo.

The season consisted of six regular season rounds being played in October and November, with three home rounds being played at Brisbane Grammar School and three away rounds in Perth, Canberra and Melbourne. The Men's and Women's Pirates had the same draw with the exception of one round as the AIS do not have a womens team. Each round the teams would play twice against the same opponent over two days of the weekend. The Queensland home rounds were a highlight for all teams during the season. Queensland consistently provided a fantastic match environment and great fan support over the three home rounds, averaging 375 spectators for each of the home rounds. The success of the home rounds was made possible to the collective efforts of the players and staff of the Queensland Pirates who have shown a strong desire to grow AVL as a showcase event.



The finals were played at the opening weekend of Australian Volleyball Schools Cup in Melbourne in early December. Both the Men's and Women's Pirates made the finals, with the Men's team in particular having a strong season only losing one match in the regular season. The Women's Pirates finished fourth after losing to favourites WA Pearls in the Semi-finals and VVA in the bronze medal match. The Pirate Men played against Canberra Heat in an epic Grand Final in which both teams played amazing volleyball in front of a loud and excited crowd of school teams. The Queensland Pirates won the match in four sets to be the first Queensland volleyball team in almost two decades to win the national championship. The season was capped off when Women's Captain Jess Ryder, Men's Captain Andrew Maclean, Shane Alexander and John Dekker were awarded All Star 7 team selection.
