PREAMBLE

The Premier Volleyball League (PVL) is a volleyball competition which is offered annually to Affiliate and Associate Affiliates of Volleyball Queensland (Affiliates). The PVL comprises of mens, womens, boys, and girls competitions. These Competition Regulations address arrangements associated with Volleyball Queensland (VQ) Affiliates entering teams into the PVL, the eligibility of players, requirements of participant teams and conduct of the competition. Competition dates, location, Divisions offered, and entry process will be available through the VQ website, www.vq.org.au.

PART 1 – COMPETITION OVERVIEW

1.0: Premier Volleyball League Overview

1.1 **Competition Format**

The Premier Volleyball League (PVL) will consist of one (1) season, played annually.

Affiliates participating in the PVL, including their players, coaches, and officials are deemed to have read and understood these Competition Regulations and agree to be governed by them.

1.2 **Competition Management**

The PVL is overseen and managed by the VQ Operations Department as well as the PVL Operations Staff (also referred to as 'Venue Staff' or 'Delivery Staff'). Oversight of the Competition is conducted by the Control Committee.

The PVL Management Staff is responsible for the management, operation, and delivery of the competition. The Management Staff consists of:

- Events Lead (Clubs) (who operates as the PVL Competition Director)
- Events Coordinator (Clubs) (who operates as the PVL Competition Manager)

The PVL Operations Staff consists of:

- Venue Supervisor
- Court Supervisors
- Operations Assistants

(1.2.1): PVL Control Committee

The role of the PVL Control Committee is to conduct the Competition within the terms of these Competition Regulations, the VQ Constitution, any additional policies, and the Federation Internationale de Volleyball (FIVB) Rules of the Game.

The Control Committee has the authority to investigate issues or breaches pertaining to the above documentation, or matters related to the fair play and integrity of the competition.

The PVL Control Committee consists of:

- Events Lead (Clubs) (Chair)
- Events Coordinator (Clubs)
- PVL Chief Referee

1.3 **Additional Documentation to Regulations**

Additional documentation to these Regulations may be provided in the form of 'PVL Season Update' emails, or addendum documentation.

- These documents and correspondence will be marked and published as '*Regulation Addendums*'.
- These addendums are to be incorporated into these Regulations at a future update.

PART 2 – PARTICIPATING TEAMS AND PARTICIPANTS

3.0: Team Nominations

3.1 Team Nominations

Entry is open to current Affiliates and Associate Affiliates of VQ for the year of competition.

- Affiliates status will be confirmed prior to acceptance of nomination. Acceptance of a nomination is at the sole discretion of Volleyball Queensland.

Volleyball Queensland in its sole discretion may admit additional teams to assist with the operation of the competition to be benefit of all teams (avoid byes, schedule conflicts, etc.)

(3.1.1): Nomination Requirements

Affiliates may only enter one (1) team into the following divisions per gender:

- Premier Division, Challenger Division
- Under 19 – Division 1, Under 17 – Division 1, Under 15 – Division 1
- *The exception to this is Under 17 – Division 2 where Affiliates may enter up to two (2) per division per gender.*

Affiliates may enter up to four (4) teams in all other divisions

(3.1.2): Entry into the Premier Division

Nominations to premier division will only be accepted on the basis of a subsequent nomination to the challenger divisions of the corresponding gender.

(3.1.3): New Affiliates Entry Restrictions

New Affiliates (that have not played in PVL prior) nominations will only be accepted into either Tier 2 or the Youth Tier. New Affiliates may request to nominate a team into Tier 1; however, they are required to provide a team list to the VQ Control Committee for consideration.

(3.1.4): PVL Affiliate Contact

Formal communication will occur through the nominated contacts listed in the nomination form. Changes must be provided to VQ in writing approved by the Affiliate's President.

4.0: Nomination Process and Payment

4.1 Nomination Process

Team nominations must be entered through the PVL entry process provided on the [VQ website](#).

4.2 Nomination Amendments and Withdrawals

Affiliates may amend or withdraw their nominations up until the date of “close of nominations”.

Withdrawal of teams after the close of nominations will incur the following financial penalties:

- Up to 50% of the nomination fee per team after the close of nomination.
- Up to 75% of the nomination fee per team after the initial draw release.
- Up to 100% of the nomination fee per team one (1) week prior to commencement of Round 1.
- 100% of the nomination fee per team after the commencement of Round 1.

4.3 Payments

Affiliates will be issued an invoice for payment of competition fees after the close of registration. All competition fees are to be settled with VQ prior to Round 5 of the competition.

4.4	<p><u>Team Bond</u></p> <p>All teams participating in the PVL will be required to pay a bond which will be refunded at the end of the season less fines accrued throughout the season (all prices include GST).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Existing Affiliates: \$200.00 per Tier 1 or Tier 2 team. - New Affiliate (1st year): \$350.00 per Tier 1 or Tier 2 team. - Late payment of the bond will incur a \$20.00 fee per team in Tier 1 or Tier 2 team that will increase an additional \$10.00 per day that the bond is not paid. The maximum fee will not exceed \$100.00. - Nominations for teams in the Youth Tiers will not be required to pay a bond.
4.5	<p><u>Unfinancial Teams/Affiliates</u></p> <p>If an affiliate has not paid their competition fees by Round 5, they forfeit any further competition points until the amount owing is paid in full.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - If fees are still outstanding one month after Round 5, the affiliate will be removed from the competition unless a payment plan is approved from the Chief Executive Officer at VQ.
5.0: Player Eligibility	
5.1	<p><u>Volleyball Queensland Membership</u></p> <p>For players to be eligible to compete in the PVL (including individual interstate and international athletes), they must be a current Full Member of VQ, and the Affiliate they represent.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - There will be “Zero Tolerance” regarding unregistered players at any stage of the season. - Registrations must be received by VQ prior to 11:59pm on the Wednesday before playing. - Players with a Recreational Membership will have a one (1) week grace period from the date the player took court to upgrade their membership to Full before penalties apply.
5.2	<p><u>Player Movements between Affiliates</u></p> <p><i>(5.2.1): Player Transfers</i></p> <p>Transfers will only be allowed during the ‘PVL Transfer Window’ as per the Calendar.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Transfer requests that are made outside this transfer window will be at the discretion of the VQ Control Committee and based on significant extenuation circumstances. <p><i>(5.2.2): Player Clearances</i></p> <p>Player Clearances will not be accepted (unless in extreme circumstances and at the discretion of the PVL Control Committee).</p> <p><i>(5.2.3): Offer Deadlines</i></p> <p>Affiliates are required to ensure that all trial/player offers to potential players are due by the Major Offer Deadlines. There are two (2) Major Offer Deadlines – please refer to the PVL Calendar.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - For a player to be eligible to compete with an Affiliate, the Affiliate must offer a position to the player prior to Major Offer Deadlines. <p>For additional details, please refer to the ‘Regulations Addendum – Affiliate Player Offers’</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Additional information is also provided in Appendix J.
5.3	<p><u>Player Eligibility</u></p> <p>Men/Boys are not eligible to play in the Women’s/Girl’s divisions and Women/Girls are not eligible to play in the Men’s/Boy’s divisions.</p> <p><i>(5.3.1): Player Nomination</i></p> <p>Each Affiliate must nominate all players playing for their Affiliate into a specific team. The eligibility of players will be outlined in Part 4 of the Regulations.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - This submission will be done via the <i>Affiliates Online</i>.

<p><i>(5.3.2): Multiple Teams in a Division</i> Where an Affiliate has multiple teams in the same division, a player may only play for one (1) of the teams in that division for the entirety of the season.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - An exemption may be provided on the basis of avoiding a forfeit. In this event the team will only be allowed to play with six (6) players total. <p><i>(5.3.3): Youth Tier Eligibility</i> Players must be under the stated age for the full calendar year of the competition (e.g. to be eligible for the U17 Division a player cannot turn 17 in the year of the competition). Additional eligibility rules related to the Youth Tiers can be found in <i>Part 4: Player Eligibilities</i></p>	
<p>5.4 <u>Illegal or Ineligible Players</u> <i>(5.4.1): Illegal/Ineligible Players</i> A team will be Forfeited for the following (but not limited to) scenarios:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Unregistered Player / Not Properly Transferred Player / Blacklisted Player - Player fielding a false name - Illegal Player / Player participating in an ineligible division <p><i>(5.4.2): Forfeit Regarding Ineligible Player</i> If an ineligible player is found to be playing in an active match (match currently in progress) in another Division, the team in the lower Division will forfeit the set(s) in which the ineligible player took court. Where possible, the match should continue from that point.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Should the ineligible player take court for the first three (3) sets, the team fielding the illegal player will be forfeited. - If an illegal player is found to have played in a lower Division after the completion of the match, the lower Division team will forfeit their respective match. <p><i>(5.4.3): Forfeit Regarding Match Times</i> A team will forfeit a match should they not attend the match at the stated time on the official draw, with respect to Clause 7.7.</p>	
<p>5.5 <u>Unlisted Player</u> All players who take court must have their name printed or written on the scoresheet team list.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Any hand-written name must have the full name of the player (First Name and Last Name). Failure to provide the full name on the scoresheet will be treated in the same nature as 'Player Not Listed' for the offending team (but not duty team). - Any player who takes the court without being properly listed on the team list will incur a penalty (see fine schedule). - 	
<p>6.0: Team Lists and Team Records</p>	
<p>6.1 <u>Player Records – Affiliates Online</u> All Affiliates are to utilise VQ's Affiliates Online System (AOL) to allocate players and team officials to the team list on the scoresheet.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Failure to updated this weekly, may incur a penalty (see fine schedule) - 	
<p>6.2 <u>Maintaining Player Records</u> After Round 3, all Affiliates must ensure that their team lists for all nominated teams have a minimum of six (6) eligible players. Failure to comply will result in penalties (see fine schedule).</p>	

PART 3 – LEAGUE STRUCTURE

7.0: Match Format and Match Conditions

7.1 **Match Rules**

All matches will be officiated in accordance with the current FIVB Rules of the current FIVB Guidelines and Case Book except where amended by these Competition Regulations.

7.2 **Match Format**

(7.2.1): [Tier 1 / Tier 2] Match Format

All matches for Tier 1 and Tier 2 will be played as Best-of-5-Sets, with a rally-point scoring system as outlined in the FIVB Official Rule of the Game

(7.2.2): [Youth Tiers] Match Format

All preliminary matches and extended preliminary matches (round robin matches) for the Youth Tier will be played as three (3) Compulsory Sets, with a rally-point scoring system, within a 60 minute timeframe.

- Set 1 and Set 2 will be played to 25 points with a two-point advantage.
- Set 3 will be played to 15 points with a two-point advantage.
 - o In the third set, a coin-toss will be performed to determine service and the side. Teams are to switch sides when either team has first reached 8 points.
 - o If a team has already won the first two (2) sets, a coin toss is not required.
 - o Regardless of whether a winner has been determined after the first two (2) sets, the third set must be played should there be any remaining time.
- No point cap will be applied to any set.

7.3 **Match Timing**

The Venue Supervisor reserves the right to permit matches to commence late without penalty due to unforeseen circumstances.

(7.3.1): [Tier 1 and Tier 2] Guaranteed Earliest Start Time

Tier 1 and Tier 2 Matches will be played under Guaranteed Earliest Start Time (GEST).

- All matches will commence (first whistle to serve) at the time stated on the official draw.
- If the previous match has delayed the start of the next match will commence at the conclusion of the pre-match protocol in section 7.5,

(7.3.2): [Youth Tier] Match Timings

All matches will commence (first whistle to serve) at the time stated on the official draw.

Any match that starts late for any reason will still finish at the scheduled finish time unless approved by the Venue Supervisor (for unforeseen circumstances).

7.4 **Match Ball and Net Heights**

The official match ball of PVL is the Mikasa V200W or the Mikasa V300W.

The following net heights will be used for each division:

7.5	<p><u>Pre-Match Protocol (Warmup)</u> <i>(7.5.1): [Tier 1 / Tier 2] Pre-Match Protocol</i> There will be a 15-minute pre-match protocol (warmup). This protocol may be altered at the discretion of the Venue Supervisor but may never exceed 20 minutes.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The pre-match protocol will begin 15 minutes before the scheduled time on the draw or at the conclusion of the previous match (if the previous match has delayed the start of the match). - Should the duty team be the next team to play, they will receive 20 minutes for the pre-match protocol. - Teams who arrive late for the pre-match protocol will not be provided with additional time. <p><i>(7.5.2): [Youth Tier] Pre-Match Protocol</i> There will be a 10-minute pre-match protocol (warmup).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The pre-match protocol will begin 10 minutes before the scheduled time on the draw. - Teams who arrive late for the pre-match protocol will not be provided with additional time. <p>See Appendix C for Pre-Match Protocol</p>						
7.6	<p><u>Amendments to Match Rules/Format</u> The following amendments have been made to the FIVB Rules of the Game 2025-2028:</p> <p><i>(7.6.1): Substitutions (Appendix B)</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The 12 Substitution Rule will be in effect for all matches. <p><i>(7.6.2): Liberos</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - In Tier 1 and Tier 2, up to two (2) Liberos can be allocated per match (Libero per Match). - In the Youth Tier, up to two (2) Liberos can be allocated per set (Libero per Set); <ul style="list-style-type: none"> o If a regular player is alternating to Libero, or a Libero alternating to a regular player, they must have the same jersey number or reverse their jersey. - The Venue Supervisor may give permission for a Libero to be redesignated as a normal player in the case of an injury to avoid a forfeit. This redesignation may occur during a set. Uniform penalties will not apply for this circumstance. <p><i>(7.6.3): [Youth Tier] Timed Match Rules</i> The following rules will only apply for Youth Tier matches that are time-limited.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - No substitutions or timeouts can be called in the last five (5) minutes of a match. - No further points may be played after the sixty (60) minute timeslot has elapsed. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> o If the Referee has whistled for service prior to the end of match, the rally must be completed and will count towards the final score. If this rally then results in a replay, the rally will be replayed and completed. The First Referee alone will determine if the whistle was blown before the end of the match. 						
7.7	<p><u>Match Commitment</u> Any team (minimum 6 players) who fails to take the court at the start of the match will be penalised.</p> <table border="1" style="width: 100%; border-collapse: collapse;"> <tr> <td style="padding: 2px;">Failure to take the court at designated start of the match</td> <td style="padding: 2px;">First set forfeited</td> </tr> <tr> <td style="padding: 2px;">Failure to take the court after 10 minutes from signalled start time</td> <td style="padding: 2px;">Second set forfeited</td> </tr> <tr> <td style="padding: 2px;">Failure to take the court after 20 minutes from signalled start time</td> <td style="padding: 2px;">Third set forfeited and match forfeited.</td> </tr> </table> <p><i>(7.7.1): Forfeited Match</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - In Tier 1 and Tier 2, where a team has forfeited the first three (3) sets, the non-forfeiting team will be declared the winner with a set score of 3-0, and point score of 75-0. - In the Youth Tier, where a team has forfeited all three (3) sets, the non-forfeiting team will be declared the winner with a set score of 3-0, and point score of 65-0.
- The team which forfeited will receive the associated fines and penalties.

7.8

Double Forfeitures

(7.8.1): [Tier 1 and Tier 2] Double Forfeiture

Where both teams have failed to take court at the designated time, both teams will forfeit Set 1. If both teams are then present and ready to play Set 2, the match shall be played as Best-of-3-Sets.

- Double forfeitures will be decided on by the Control Committee.

(7.8.2): [Youth Tier] Double Forfeiture

- Double forfeitures will be decided by the Control Committee.

7.9

Duty Commitments and Officials

Teams will be required to perform duty where allocated on the draw.

- Each duty team must provide a First Referee, a Second Referee, a Scorer, and two (2) Line-Judges. An Assistant Scorer is also desirable.
- The full duty team is required to report to the score bench at the [coin toss](#).
- Failure to report for duty at the coin toss will result in a fine, this penalty will be increased per person missing at the start of the match (see [fine schedule](#)).
- All duty teams must ensure that the scoresheet is completed in accordance with the scoresheet checklist provided on the score bench.

Duty members are not permitted to use any technological device or similar, which may distract them from the match. A fine will apply for any participants in breach of this clause. Participants will be fined multiple times should this occur multiple times.

(7.9.1): Duty Team Accreditations

- Duty teams in a Tier 1 Division are required to provide a First Referee with at least a Volleyball Australia Level 2 State or Associate Officiating Accreditation.
- Duty teams in all other Divisions are required to provide a First Referee with at least a Volleyball Australia Level 1 Officiating Accreditation (see [fine schedule](#)).

(7.9.2): [Youth Tier] Duty Team Requirements

- Each team in the Youth Tier is to provide a responsible duty adult to supervise the duty team for the entire duration of the match, including the pre-match protocol. Fines will apply for non-compliance (see [fine schedule](#)).
- The duty adult must be 18 years or older, must not be a player in the team, and must wear the assigned duty adult sash provided. The role of the duty adult is outlined in Appendix I.

Under 15 Division	The duty adult must have an active role in the duty. They should be a member of the referee team (First Referee, Second Referee or Scorer)
Under 17 Division	The duty adult must have an active role in the duty. They should be a member of the referee team (First Referee, Second Referee or Scorer)
Under 19 Division	The duty adult must monitor the duty. They should assist with the duties on the scorebench, or second referee.

(7.9.3): First Referees

- Only referees appointed by VQ to matches will be paid. Referees wishing to be paid will need to be listed on the affiliates referee list or application as a non-playing referee.

7.10	<p><u>Player Attendance and Team Lists</u></p>
<p>For a player to have been recorded as having played, that player must be listed on the team list and have entered the court for at least one (1) completed rally.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Players may be added to the team list after the start of the match only with the approval of the Venue Supervisor. Team officials may be added to the team list after the start of the match without needing the approval of any PVL Operations Staff. - Players listed on the team list but did not take court is not counted as having played. <p>In the event of a forfeit by the opposition team, for the winning team:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - If the forfeit occurs at the venue without notice, all players that are listed or written on the scoresheet and are present will be recorded as having played. - If the forfeit is notified by the opposition team prior to the scheduled day of the match, all players that are listed on the scoresheet (via Affiliates Online) at the time of the forfeiture will be recorded as having played. 	
7.11	<p><u>Youth Tier] Set Completion</u></p>

PART 4: PLAYER ELIGIBILITIES

9.0: Eligibility Models

9.1

Eligibility Models

The eligibility of a player to participate in a particular division will be governed by the following:

1. Individual Player Eligibility ([see Clause 9.2](#))
2. Top 8 List
3. Tier 1 Restriction List
4. Divisional Brackets

A full diagram on Tiers and Divisional Brackets can be found in [Appendix A](#).

9.2

Individual Player Eligibility

(9.2.1): Elite Player List

- An Elite Player is any player who is not under 19 years for the full calendar year of the competition, that has represented a team or program in any of the following:
 - o A Team in the Australian Volleyball Super League ([see Clause 9.2.2, 9.2.3](#)).
 - o An Australian Senior National Team ([see Clause 9.2.4](#)).
 - o An International Player ([see Clause 9.2.7](#)).
- Any player on the *Elite Player List* will only be eligible to play in the Premier Division.

(9.2.2): Queensland Pirates List

- The Queensland Pirates List is a list of nine (9) players that is compiled after the completion of the previous year's *Australian Volleyball Super League* consisting of eight (8) players and a libero.
 - o This list will be based on cumulative court time during the AVSL, however may be altered due to other events during the year.
- Any player that is listed on this *Queensland Pirates List* will only be eligible to play in the Premier Division for the duration of the PVL season.

(9.2.3): National Australian Team Player

- Any player who has represented the Australian Senior National Volleyball Team (either Beach or Indoor) in the preceding calendar year and current calendar year will only be eligible to play in the Premier Division.
- This Clause does not apply to players who are under 19 years for the full calendar year of the current PVL season.

(9.2.4): International Transfer Clearance

- PVL is a Tier 3 Competition in the FIVB National Federation Competition Category. An International Transfer Clearance (ITC) is still required to participate, however it will not incur a fee. For more details, please contact [Volleyball Australia](#).

(9.2.5): International Player Eligibility

- Players who have participated in the highest level of competition (Tier 1 Competition) for their home country in the preceding calendar year or current calendar year will only be eligible to participate for the Premier Division.
- Players who have participated in the second highest level of competition (Tier 2 Competition) for their home country in the preceding calendar year or current calendar year will only be eligible to participate for the Premier Division or Challenger Division.

Competition Regulations

- Players who have not participated in the highest or second highest level of competition (Tier 1 and Tier 2 Competition) for their home country in the preceding calendar year or current calendar year may participate in any Division.
- It is the responsibility of Affiliates to confirm an International Player's eligibility to play in Australia with respect to the Tiers in their home country's National Federation Competition Category. Please contact the appropriate National Federation for further details on the International Player's eligibility to play.
- If an Affiliate does not believe that a player who has recently competed overseas does not meet the standards of the criteria listed above, they may apply for an exemption to the Clause. Exemptions will be treated on their merits by the PVL Control Committee.

9.3

Top 8 List

The Top 8 List is a list of eight (8) players, for each Tier 1 team for an Affiliate, determined by both the cumulative court time of a player as well as the *Queensland Pirates List*.

- The Top 8 List will be produced for each team in Tier 1.
- The Top 8 List will be established and published after Round 3 and will be updated after the completion of each round by Wednesday (11:59pm).

(9.3.1): Terminology of the Top 8 List

	List Position	
Top 8 List	1-8	Refers to all players ranked from 1 through to 8 of the Top 8 List.
T8 Locked Players	1-5	Refers to the players ranked from 1 through to 5 of the Top 8 List.
T8 Subset	6-8	Refers to the players ranked from 6 through to 8 of the Top 8 List.
T8 Selected Sixth Player	Chosen 6 th	A player selected from the T8 Subset (refer to 9.3.2)
T8 Restricted Players	1-5 and Selected Sixth	Refers to the <i>T8 Locked Players</i> and the <i>T8 Selected Sixth Player</i> .
T8 Unlocked Players		Refers to the remaining two (2) players from the T8 Subset

(9.3.2): Selection of the T8 Selected Sixth

Affiliates must select one (1) player from the *T8 Subset*; this player (*T8 Selected Sixth*) is ineligible to play in any other Division except that in which they appear on the Top 8 List or a team in a higher Division for the upcoming round.

9.4

Tier 1 Restriction List

The Tier 1 Restriction List is a list of eight (8) players from the Premier Division, and five (5) players from the Challenger Division for each Affiliate, which is determined solely on the cumulative court time of a player.

- Should a player appear on both lists for the Premier Division and the Challenger Division, the second instance of their name will be removed and replaced with the player below them in cumulative court time.
- Should an Affiliate only have a Challenger Division Team, only five (5) players will be listed in the Tier 1 Restriction List.
- The Tier 1 Restriction List will be established and published after Round 3 and will be updated after the completion of each round by Wednesday (11:59pm).

9.5	<p><u>Divisional Bracket</u></p> <p>A Divisional Bracket is a grouping of three (3) Divisions. A Divisional Bracket encompasses the Division in which a player is nominated (<i>Nominated Division</i>), the Division directly higher than the Division which a player is nominated (<i>Upper Division</i>), and the Division directly lower than the Division which a player is nominated (<i>Lower Division</i>).</p>
9.6	<p><u>First 3 Rounds Exception</u></p> <p>In the first three (3) rounds of the competition, a player may play in an unlimited number of matches within a single Tier</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A player who is eligible to play in the Youth Tier may only play one (1) match in the Youth Tier, and may play for an unlimited number of matches within one other single Tier for that round.
10.0: Player Eligibilities and Nomination	
10.1	<p><u>Player Nomination</u></p> <p>All players that participate in PVL must be nominated into a Division (Team) by Round 4.</p> <p><i>(10.1.1): Nomination of Players</i></p> <p>Players will automatically be assigned to a team based on the team they have been assigned to on Affiliates Online after Round 3. - An exceptional situation outside of the scenarios written. This movement must be justified by the Affiliate, and the decision will be made by the Control Committee.

Once the request for a player to be moved to a lower division has been approved, that player may only play for the teams within their Divisional Bracket. They will no longer be eligible to play into a higher Tier and will not be eligible to be reallocated for the remainder of the competition season.

- A player that appears on the Top 8 List or Tier 1 Restriction List is not eligible to move to a lower division. (subject to Clause 11.2)

10.2 **Three Round Adjustment Period**

In the first three (3) rounds of PVL, a player may participate in an unlimited number of matches across the competition (with exception to Youth Tier and Clause 5.3.2), so long as they are not restricted by Clause 9.2 and its subclauses.

10.3 **Player Eligibility – General**

Players are restricted by the following eligibility models:

- Individual Player Eligibility
- Top 8 List
- Tier 1 Restriction List
- Divisional Brackets

(10.3.1): Playing in Multiple Teams per Round and Divisional Eligibility

A player may play in a maximum of three (3) teams per round across all Tiers of the competition.

- The player must play for the team that they are nominated for. Players may also play for any team within their divisional bracket (with respect to Clause 5.3.2).
- Except for Youth Tier athletes (see Clause 11), athletes may play for a maximum of two (2) teams within their tier and a maximum of one (1) team outside of their tier per round (with respect to Clause 11.2).
- Where an Affiliate has multiple teams within the same division, a player may only play for one (1) of the teams in that division for the entirety of the season.
 - o To avoid forfeitures, a Temporary Player Exemption may be completed – see Clause 12.1.

(10.3.2): Playing in Multiple Teams per Round (Libero)

- A player may only play as a libero for one (1) team per round (including rescheduled matches for that round) but may play a different position in another team in their divisional bracket, (See Clause 9.5) This Clause does not apply to Liberos in the Youth Tier

(10.3.3): Appearing on the Tier 1 Restriction List

Subject to Clause 11.2, a player that is currently on the Tier 1 Restriction List is ineligible to play for any other team outside of Tier 1.

- If a player that is nominated for a team in Tier 2 appears on the Tier 1 Restriction List, the Affiliate will be asked if they would like to reallocate the player up to a team in Tier 1 or show cause as to why the player should be able to continue in their nominated team in Tier 2.
- Should the Affiliate choose to reallocate the player to the higher division, the player will retain their position on the Tier 1 Restriction List.

- Should the Affiliate choose not to reallocate the player and justify their appearances, the player will be temporarily removed from the Tier 1 Restriction List. If their next appearance in Tier 1 causes them to reappear on the Tier 1 Restriction List, they will automatically be reallocated into the higher division.

10.4

Player Eligibility – Tier 1 Restrictions

(10.4.1): Top 8 List – Queensland Pirates List

Any player that is included in the Queensland Pirates List will be automatically listed on the Top 8 List for the Affiliate's highest team as soon as they have taken court, regardless of cumulative match time.

- Players will be listed on the Top 8 List on the order in which they appear on the Queensland Pirates List.
- Where a player from the *Queensland Pirates List* has not attended a match ([see Clause 7.10](#)) over 4 consecutive rounds (excluding byes), they will be removed from the Top 8 List for that team until their next attendance.

(10.4.2): Premier Division Top 8 Eligibility

Subject to Clause 11.2, the Premier Division *T8 Restricted Players* ([refer to 9.3.1](#)) are only eligible to play in the Premier Division for the upcoming round. The Premier Division *T8 Unlocked Players* are eligible to play in the Challenger Division.

(10.4.3): Challenger Division Top 8 Eligibility

Subject to Clause 11.2, the Challenger Division *T8 Restricted Players* ([refer to 9.3.1](#)) are only eligible to play in the Challenger Division or Premier Division for the upcoming round.

- The Challenger Division *T8 Unlocked Players* are eligible to play in a higher division, or in Division 1 should they not appear on the Tier 1 Restriction List.

(10.4.4): Tier 1 Eligibility in Lower Divisions

With respect to Clause 10.3.1, a player nominated in a Tier 1 team (who is not restricted by Individual Player Eligibilities, the Top 8 List, or the Tier 1 Restriction List) may only play down to the following divisions:

- Division 1

Exemptions may be applied for and treated on its merits.

10.5

Illegal / Ineligible Players

(10.5.1): Illegal Player due to Top 8 Restriction or Individual Restriction

If a player is found to be playing in an active match (match currently in progress) in a division where they are ineligible, the team in the lower division will forfeit the set(s) in which the illegal player took court.

- Where possible, the match should continue from that point.
- Should the ineligible player take court for the first three (3) sets, the team fielding the illegal player will forfeit the game.
- If an ineligible player is found to have played in a lower division after the competition of the match, that lower division match will be forfeited.

(10.5.2): Illegal Player due to Tier Bracket Restrictions

If a player is found to be playing in an active match (match currently in progress) in a division where they are ineligible, the team in the lower division will forfeit the set(s) in which the ineligible player took court.

- Where possible, the match should continue from that point.

- Should the ineligible player take court for the first three (3) sets, the team fielding the illegal player will be forfeited.
- If an ineligible player is found to have played in a lower division after the competition of the match, that lower division match will be forfeited.

11.0: Youth Tier – Player Eligibility

11.1 **Eligibility of Players in the Youth Tier**

(11.1.1): Playing in Multiple Teams per Round

A player nominated into the Youth Tier may play for a maximum of three (3) teams per round across all Tiers of the competition.

- A player nominated in a Youth Tier team, may play in a maximum of one (1) team within the Youth Tier (subject to Clause 12.1), and a maximum of two (2) teams outside of the Youth Tier per round (subject to clause .

(11.1.2): Youth Tier Liberos

A player who has played as a Libero in the Youth Division is eligible to play as Libero for one (1) other team in any Tier per Round.

11.2 **Youth Athletes and Tier 1 Restrictions**

(11.2.1): Youth Athletes in the Top 8

Youth Tier players are not restricted by the Top 8 Tier Restrictions, provided that the following conditions are met:

- The Athlete is nominated in a Youth Tier team;
- The Athlete regularly plays in Tier 1; and
- The Athlete appears in the weekly Top 8 restrictions,

Then, the Youth Athlete may participate in both their Tier 1 team and their Youth Tier team (subject to Clauses 11.2.2 and 11.2.3).

(11.2.2): Application of Division Restrictions

Youth Tier Athletes utilising Clause 11.2.1, must still comply with all other Top 8 and divisional restrictions outside of Clause 11.2, including, but not limited to, clauses 9.4 & 10.3.1.

(11.2.3): Amendment to Clause 10.3.1 for Youth Athletes

For the purposes of Clause 10.3.1, the following amendments apply to Youth Athletes:

- If a Youth Tier Athlete would be otherwise restricted by the Challenger Top 8, they may play up to two (2) Tier 1 matches.
- If the Athlete would otherwise be restricted by the Premier Top 8, they may only participate in their Youth Tier match and their Premier team match.

(11.2.4): Division Restriction for Youth Athletes

Youth Athletes utilising Clause 11.2.1 must be nominated in the highest division for their respective Youth Tier (e.g. Division 1 in U17 Girls).

- If the Athlete is nominated in a lower division but uses Clause 11.2.1 to participate in both Youth Tier and Tier 1, the athlete will be re-nominated into the higher division in their respective tier
- This re-nomination cannot be reversed, except in certain exemptions provided by Management Staff (via email).

12.0: Exemption Requests (Preliminary Rounds)

12.1

Temporary Player Exemption

A Player (“Temporary Player”) may play for an additional team in order to prevent that team from forfeiting. This exemption must be requested to the Venue Supervisor (at the venue) or Management Staff (via email) prior to the commencement of the match.

- An exemption will only be granted if the team has five (5) players or less.
- This exemption will be recorded and signed for by the requesting coach.
- The Temporary Player must be from the same Affiliate as the team.

The team for which the Temporary Player is seeking to play may only have a maximum of six (6) players total (inclusive of the Temporary Player) for the duration of the match.

- Should an additional player seeking to play in that team arrive, the temporary player must be substituted off.
- Teams may not have a Libero while a Temporary Player is used.
- The Temporary Player may be sought from any team available, however it is encouraged that it be one from a lower division.
- The Temporary Player may also participate in the match for their nominated team in the same round.
- Players may only play for a maximum of three (3) matches per round.
 - o A Temporary Player may play for two (2) matches within the Youth Tier and one (1) match in any division in an1.
- Temporary Players will be marked as “T” on the scoresheet (where Captains/Liberos are marked) by the requesting coach ([See Example](#)).

12.2

Injury Exemptions – Tier 1

If a Tier 1 player is injured, an Affiliate may submit the *Exemption Request Form (Injury)* to permit for a replacement player to cover for the player during a stipulated injury period without effecting the replacement player’s status in the lower divisions.

- This request must be lodged by the Monday (5pm) prior to the round.

The replacement player will not be captured in the Top 8 List for the period of time stipulated.

PART 5 – COMPETITION STANDING AND FINALS SERIES

13.0: Competition Points

13.1 Allocation of Competition Points

Competition points will be allocated as below.

13.2 Competition Ranking

Competition ranking refers to the rank of each team within a division. The ranking of teams on the Competition Ladder is determined in the following order:

- The most Competition Points
- The highest Set Ratio (5 decimal places)
- The highest Point Ratio (5 decimal places)
- Head-to-Head: The result of the last match played between the two (2) tied teams.

(13.2.1): Calculation of Set and Point Ratios

Set Ratio	$\text{Set Ratio} = \frac{\text{Total Sets Won}}{\text{Total Sets Played}}$
Point Ratio	$\text{Point Ratio} = \frac{\text{Total Points Won}}{\text{Total Points Played}}$

(13.2.2): Unequal Preliminary Matches Played

In the event where teams in a division/pool have played an unequal number of preliminary matches or extended preliminary matches, the competition points will be replaced by average competition points; this will be rounded to 5 decimal places.

Average competition points will be calculated as per below:

$$\text{Average Competition Points} = \frac{\text{Competition Points}}{\text{Total Matches Played}}$$

14.0: Finals Series

14.1 Finals Series

The length of the Finals Series may differ across divisions due to a division's size. The Finals Series (or Finals Format) refers to matches that are not classified as Preliminary Matches or Extended Preliminary Matches on the official draw.

14.2 Finals Series – Match Format

(14.2.1): [Tier 1 / Tier 2] Finals Series Match Format – No change to format.

(14.2.2): [Youth Tier] Finals Series Match Format

All matches in the Finals Series will be played as Best-of-3 Sets, untimed, with a rally point scoring system.

- Affiliates must outline why the player should be allowed to play in the Finals Series as well as the reason they were not able to satisfy the number of matches required.
 - o If the reason is due to medical/injury, please refer to Clause 15.3.1.1.

(15.3.1.1): Returning Injured Player

Should the injured player be able to return during the Finals Series, the Affiliate must choose between the injured player or the exempted player to continue in the Finals Series.

- Should both players take court, the match will be suspended and the illegal player removed. Should this occur and be found during an active match, this will be treated as an illegal substitution.
- Should the returning player be injured again after they have returned, another exemption must be applied for.

Exemptions will be treated on their merits. Exemptions must be submitted via the online form by 5:00pm on the Monday before the start of the Finals Series for that division.

- This exemption must be submitted using the *Exemption Request Form (Eligibility)*.



PART 6 – COMPETITION POLICIES

16.0: Officiating and Officials

16.1 **Referee Rostering**

Affiliates participating in any Tier 1 division must provide at least two (2) qualified Level 2 State or Level 2 Associate Referees per team in Tier 1. These referees will be placed into a pool of referees to be used in the rostering of First Referees for these divisions.

- Should a First Referee not be assigned, the assigned team will provide a suitable referee.

(16.1.1): Nominating First Referees

- Failure to provide two (2) qualified Referees by 15/04/2026 will receive a fine (see [fine schedule](#))
- Failure to provide a qualified First Referee for assigned duty games, will receive a fine (see [fine schedule](#))

17.0: Uniforms

17.1 **Uniform Requirement**

All players must wear a uniform, complete with the following:

(17.1.1): Playing Jersey/Shirt

- The playing jersey/shirt (including the Libero) must have a permanently fixed number between 1 and 99 on both the front and back.
 - o In the event there is a duplicate number on the team list, tape may be used temporarily change the jersey number for that one (1) round.
- The playing jersey/shirt must be consistent in colour and design throughout the team, with the exception of the Libero uniform.

(17.1.2): Libero Playing Jersey/Shirt

- The playing jersey/shirt for the Libero must be contrasting to the rest of the team jerseys or have a different dominant colour to any colour in the team uniform.
- In the Youth Tier, as the Libero can be changed per set, players must wear an alternate strip with the same number as what was originally worn. (i.e. the number on both shirts must be the same).
- The original jersey may be flipped with the permission of the Venue Operations Staff.

(17.1.3): Playing Shorts

- Male players must wear shorts that are of a consistent colour to the rest of the team.
 - o The design of the shorts may differ slightly with manufacturer.
- Female players can wear shorts, sports briefs or bike pants, provided the uniform is generally consistent throughout the team in terms of colour.

(17.1.4): Alternation to Uniforms

- Provided that the design and colour are consistent, variations of the team uniform, such as long-sleeve shirts or long pants are also permitted.

(17.1.5): Sponsoring

- Sponsor logos may differ across the team so long as the overall design of the uniform is consistent.

(17.1.6): Penalties Associated with Uniforms

- Penalties relating to uniforms will be issued by the Management or PVL Operations Staff.

(17.1.7): Uniforms Exemptions

- Uniform exemptions may be requested from either Competition Management or the Venue Supervisor for that round.
- Exemptions will apply for one (1) round, or for a specified period of time.

18.0: Behavioural Policies and Guidelines

18.1 **Behavioural Misconduct**

The PVL Operations Staff as well as the Management Staff have the power to sanction participants (players, coaches, managers, etc) where required.

(18.1.1): Participant Behavioural Conduct

All participants are to abide by the [VQ Code of Conduct](#), [VQ Social Media Policy](#) and any other polices deemed relevant.

(18.1.2): Spectator Behavioural Conduct

All spectators are to abide by the VQ Code of Conduct. VQ reserves the right to remove any individual whose behaviour is in breach of the VQ code of conduct, VQ Social Media policy and any other polices deemed relevant.

18.2 **Sanctions - Player and Team Officials**

(18.2.1): Red Cards During Match

Any participant who receives two (2) written warnings or two (2) Red Cards (excluding time delay sanctions) within a five (5) week period will be;

- a) suspended from being involved at PVL for one (1) round.

(18.2.2): Expulsion During Match

Any player or team official who is sanctioned with expulsion (Red & Yellow together) will be;

- a) As per FIVB Official Rules of the game. (expelled immediately from the set in which they incurred the sanction)
- b) suspended from being involved at PVL for two (2) rounds.
- c) Summoned to appear before the VQ Judiciary.

(18.2.3): Disqualification During Match

Any player or team official who is sanctioned with disqualification (Red & Yellow apart) will be;

- a) As per FIVB Official Rules of the game. (expelled immediately from the match in which they incurred the sanction and escorted out the venue)
- b) suspended from being involved at PVL for three (3) rounds.
- c) Summoned to appear before the VQ Judiciary.

(18.2.4): Sanctions after Match Completion

As per FIVB official rules.

(18.2.5): Assessment of Sanction Validity

Before any suspension is issued, the PVL Control Committee will convene to assess the validity of the sanctions issued by the referee.

18.3 **Appeals Related to Behaviour**

Matters concerning discipline will be referred to the VQ Judiciary Committee for action as outlined in VQ's *Complaints Handling Procedure*, this must be submitted within three (3) days of notice.

19.0: On-the-Spot Protest Resolution	
19.1	<p><u>On the Spot Protest Guideline</u></p> <p>A match protest will be resolved using the On-the-Spot Protest Resolution guideline. Match protests are not subject to further appeal.</p> <p>Should a team believe that a match official has incorrectly applied or misinterpreted a rule, they should:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Immediately, at the completion of the rally, inform the Second Referee that they wish to launch an On-the-Spot Protest. 2. The First Referee will suspend the game and consult with PVL Operations Staff, who will perform an On-the-Spot Protest Resolution. <p>The Court Supervisor or Venue Supervisor should (the Court Supervisor be unavailable) will assess the validity of the protest. - The protest will be noted on the scoresheet.

The decision by the Court Supervisor or Venue Supervisor is final.

19.2

Appeals

(19.2.1): Appeals Regarding Fines, Sanctions, and Scoresheet Penalties

An appeal regarding fines, sanctions, scoresheet penalties and ineligible or illegal players must be submitted via the Competition Portal within three (3) days of receipt of the penalty Infringement Notice.

(19.2.2): Appeals Regarding Management of the PVL

Appeals against a decision of the VQ Control Committee must be lodged to the VQ Chief Executive Officer within three (3) days of receiving a decision in accordance with VQ's "Complaints Handling Procedure".

20.0: Injuries

20.1

Blood Rule Procedure

In the event that blood is present, or a player is injured on court, the rally is immediately cancelled, and in the case of blood, the match suspended. The playing surface, player(s), ball, net, and all equipment will be assessed for traces of blood.

- Any bleeding player(s) with blood on them, will be escorted off the court by PVL Operations Staff to first aid where they will be able to clean off all traces of blood.
- The time will be paused (in Youth Tier matches) to assess/sanitise the court of blood. The match will not be extended to make up time lost during this break in play.

Once there is no blood present on court, other players, or playing equipment, the match shall resume immediately with a Blood Rule Substitution ([refer to Clause 20.2](#)).

If, in the event that an injured or ill player cannot be substituted legally or exceptionally, Clause 20.5 (*Medical Timeout*) will be followed. If after 5 minutes has elapsed, and the player is not able to continue, the team will be declared in completed and the match forfeited.

If blood is present on court, all players (who do not have blood on them) will be vacated to the benches while the court and affected areas are cleaned and disinfected by PVL Operations Staff.

- The time taken to disinfect the court and equipment will be added onto the 60 minutes and played until that time has elapsed (Youth Tier timed matches).

20.2

Blood Rule Substitutions

If a player is bleeding, they may be substituted out for any player on the team list who is not already on the court.

- If a Libero is on court during the Blood Rule, they may be exchanged for the original player, be redesignated, then substituted on for the bleeding player in the same interruption.
- Blood Rule Substitutions are not counted as official substitutions but will be noted on the scoresheet to maintain rotational (service) order.

The Venue Supervisor alone will determine if an incident is substantial enough to constitute an exceptional match interruption. If a match is unable to be moved to an alternate court at the same venue, follow Clause 20.4.3.</p> <p><i>(20.4.3): Procedure for Exceptional Match Interruptions</i></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The match will be delayed until the playing surface is cleared, or an alternate court can be secured (whichever occurs first) 2. If the delay exceeds one (1) hour, both captains will be asked if their respective teams wish to continue or reschedule the match. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Should both captains agree to continue the match FIVB protocol will be followed (Clause 17.3.2.1 and Clause 17.3.2.2 in the FIVB Rules of the Game 2021-2024). b. 22.4 Awards for Interstate Affiliates

The following Clause is addendum to Section 21.0 for Interstate Affiliate nominations.

All Interstate Affiliates entered into the PVL will receive the full rights afforded to the Affiliates of Volleyball Queensland in terms with their participation in the Premier Volleyball League.

- If an Interstate Affiliate has placed first (1st), second (2nd), or third (3rd), they will receive the medals associated with that position, Affiliates of VQ who have also placed will receive the medals based on their finishing position including the Interstate Affiliates.



PART 7 – FINE SCHEDULE

23.0: Penalties and Fines

23.1 Penalties and Penalty Infringement Notice

There are several penalties and fines associated with the failure to comply with several rules of the competition. These fines will be issued by either the Management or PVL Operations Staff.

Where an Affiliate has been issued a penalty, a *Penalty Infringement Notice* will appear on the Competition Portal after the breach has been identified and verified. Additional methods of communication may be adopted at the discretion of VQ.

23.2 Fine Schedule

*Where a team has forfeited multiple matches (more than 2 forfeits in 4 weeks) without reasonable cause, they may be required to show cause to maintain their eligibility to compete in PVL.

(23.3.1): Crediting of Match Forfeit Fees

- The forfeiting team must still pay the forfeiture fines associated with the forfeit of the match to VQ.

(23.3.2): Escalation of Forfeit Fines

Where a match has not been played as a result of a forfeit by a team, there will be an escalating fine schedule as follows:

- 1st Forfeit: \$150.00 & -2 Competition points
- 2nd Forfeit: \$225.00 (fine + 50%) & -4 Competition points– team will also need to show cause why they should remain in the competition.
- 3rd Forfeit: \$300.00 (fine + 100%) & -6 Competition Points– team will not be eligible to participate in the Finals Series and will be disallowed to enter the PVL for the following year.

The escalation of Forfeit Fines will only apply to teams in Tier 1 and Tier 2. Teams in the Youth Tier are exemption from these escalations.

PART 8 – ADDITIONAL DEFINITIONS

Definitions

Definition of terms in the Regulation where not already defined within the Regulations.

Affiliates	An incorporated Member Association/Club that run/enter into volleyball and/or beach volleyball competitions. They may select representative teams to participate in volleyball and/or beach volleyball competitions/events. They must register all members, provide financial reports to VQ and pay the membership fees prescribed.
Associate Affiliate	Are not necessarily incorporated entities, however, may represent a particular stakeholder or advocacy group that is involved with the volleyball and/or beach volleyball community.
Club Championship	The title awarded to the Affiliate who has accumulated the most Championship points in the Premier Volleyball League.
Completed Rally	A sequence of playing actions which results in the award of a point.
Division	A grouping of teams into a specific group. [Youth Tier] A grouping of teams within an Age Based Group.
Duty Adult (Duty Team Adult)	A responsible person at or over the age of 18 years of age. The duty team adult does not need to be a representative of the duty team’s Affiliate but cannot be a player in the team.
Extended Preliminary Match	A subset of matches included in the round robin matches extending past the preliminary matches. These matches are not a part of the Finals Format/Series.
Finals Format / Finals Series	A subset of matches where participation is determined by the ranking on the Competition Ladder or by a match in the Finals Series after the completion of the Preliminary and Extended Preliminary Matches.
FIVB	The Federation Internationale de Volleyball is the governing body for all forms of Volleyball on a global level.
Libero	A class of player who acts as the defensive specialist for the team. The Libero Player is defined in Chapter 6 of the FIVB Rules of the Game 2021-2024.

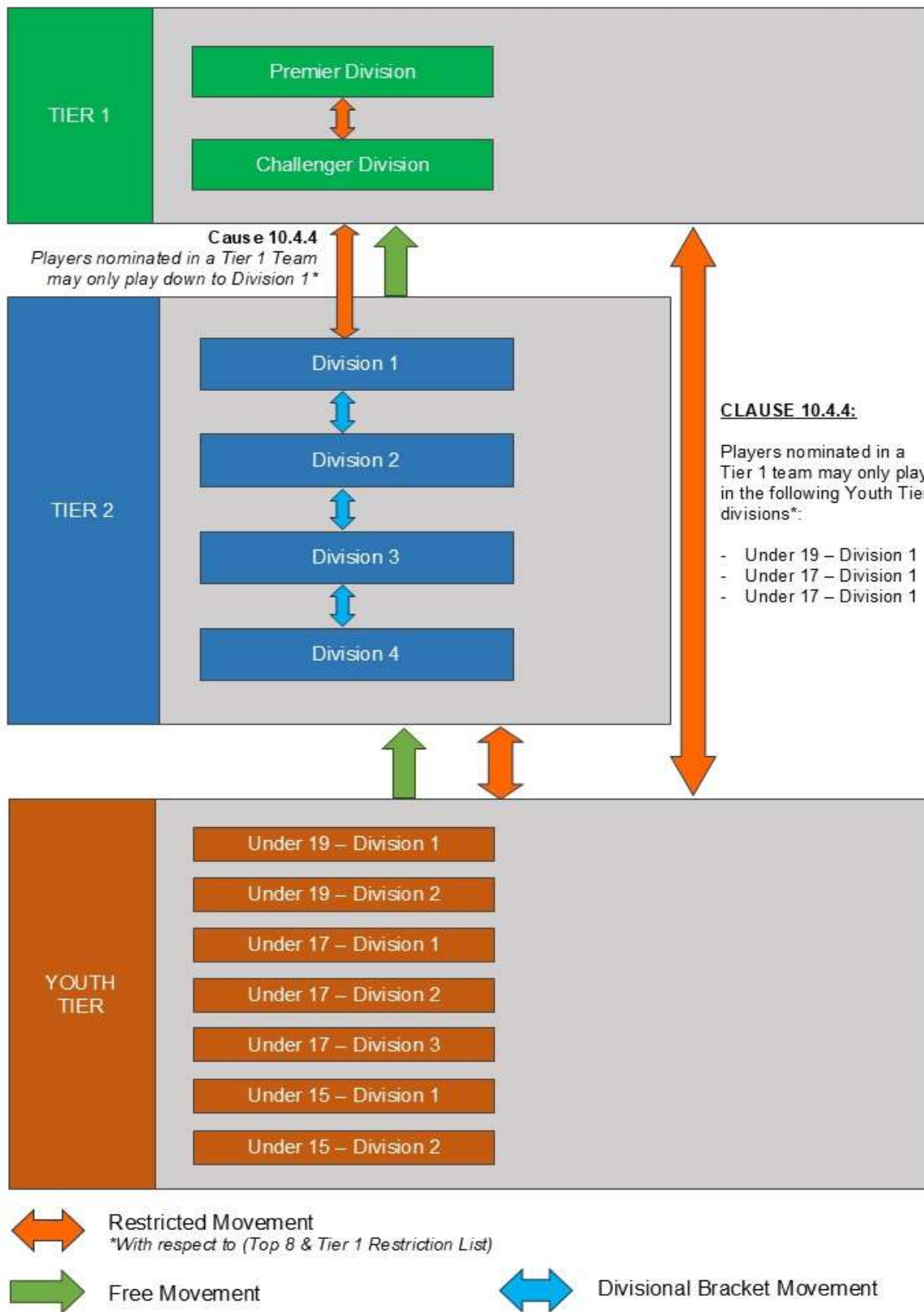

APPENDIX B – 12 Substitution Rule

- a) A team shall be allowed a maximum of twelve (12) substitutions in any one set. Players starting a set may be replaced by a substitute and may subsequently re-enter the set twice. Each substitute may enter the set three times. A player shall not enter the set for a fourth time (starting shall count as an entry). Players re-entering the set must assume the original position in the service order in relation to other teammates. No change may be made in a player's position in the service order unless necessitated by an injury requiring an abnormal substitution under the provisions of paragraph b) below. Any number of players may enter the set in each position in the service order.
- b) If through any injury a player is unable to play and substitution cannot be legally made the team is entitled to make an EXCEPTIONAL substitution beyond the limits of paragraph (a).
(This means that ANY player on the bench may replace the injured player)
- c) If through injury or accident a player is unable to play and substitution cannot be made under the provisions of paragraph a) or b), the first referee may grant a special time-out under the provisions of the rules of the game.
- d) If a team becomes incomplete through expulsion of a player and substitution cannot be made under the provisions of paragraph a) above, the team loses the set by default, keeping the points acquired. If a team becomes incomplete through disqualification of a player and substitution cannot be made under the provisions of paragraph a) above, the team loses the match by default, keeping the sets and points acquired.

Example

The following diagram illustrates how substitutions are recorded on the scoresheet.

In the example shown above, the starting line-up is 10, 4, 11, 2, 1 and 7. This means that these players made their first entry for the set. The coach then substitutes into position one (I) players numbered 6, 9, 8 and 3. Number 10 has made three (3) entries and is not permitted any more entries for the set. The same can be said for players number 2 and 5 in position four (IV).

The players numbered 10, 6, 9, 8 and 3, must remain in position one (I) and none of them can be used to substitute into another position in this set. For example, player 8 has only appeared twice so far and can therefore make another appearance on court but only in position one (I) and only if no more than twelve substitutions are used per set. In the example shown above, all twelve substitutions have been used.

The scorer recording the substitutions will use the left side column first for each position and when the left is full use the right side column. There is no requirement to record the score at the time of each substitution. The Scorer reports the 11th and 12th substitutions of the team and the third court entry of a player to the second referee who then indicates to the coach concerned and First Referee in that order.

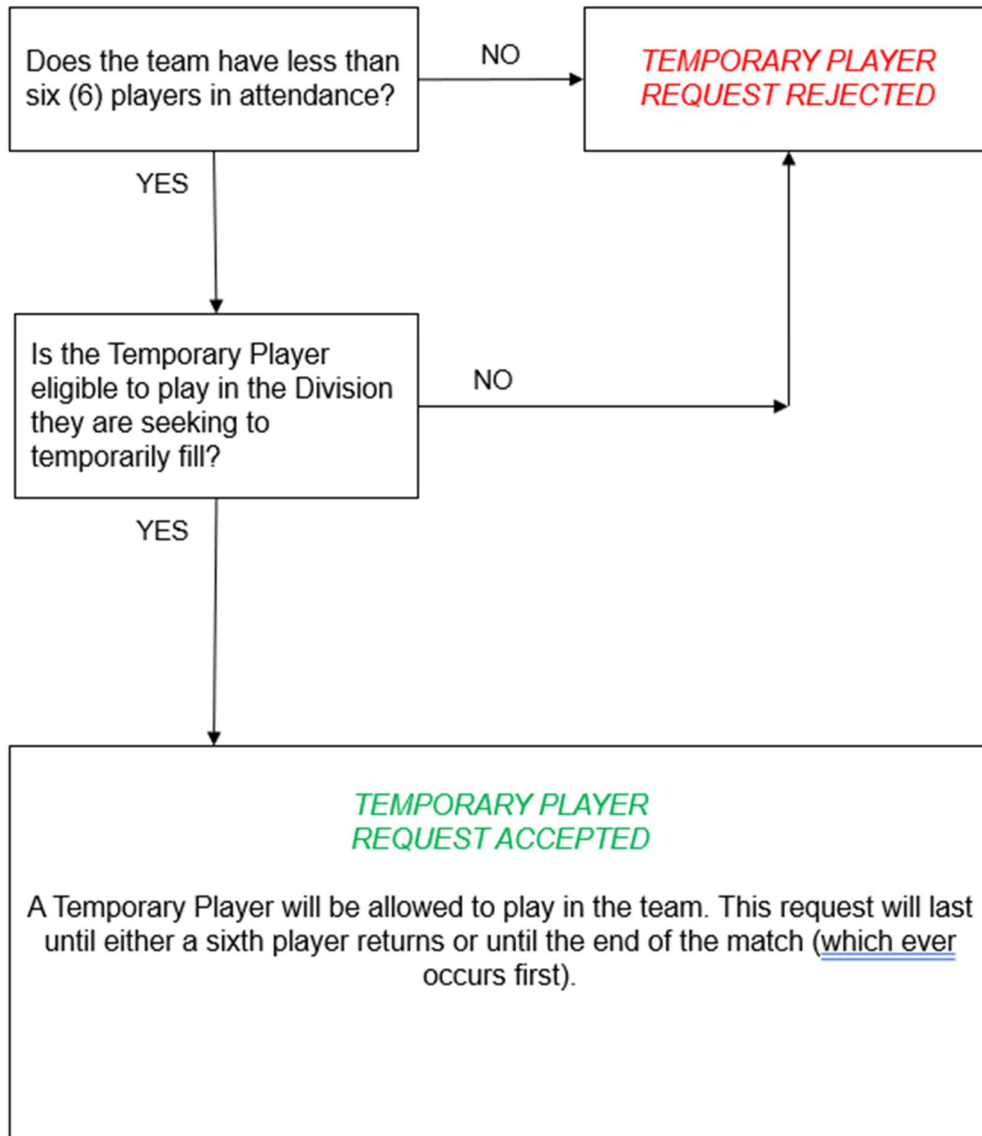

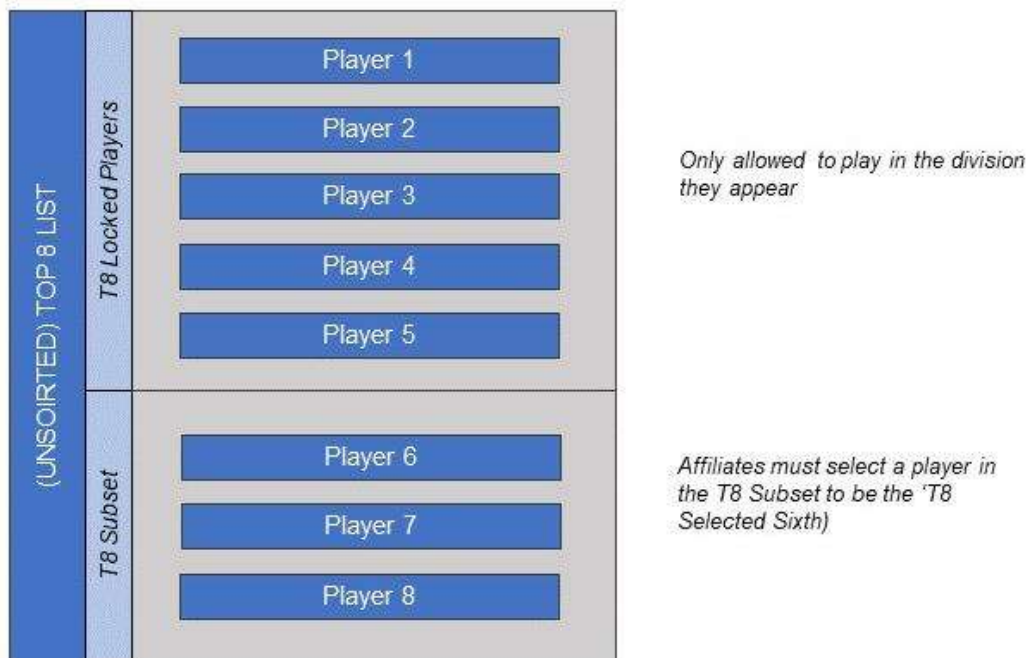

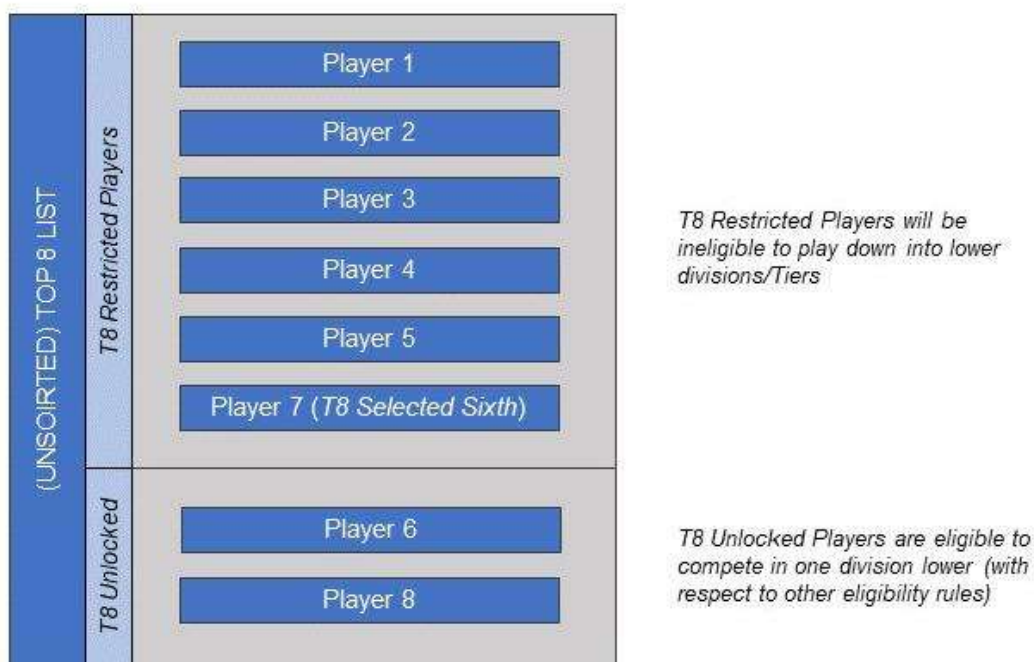

TEMPORARY PLAYER REQUEST FLOWCHART



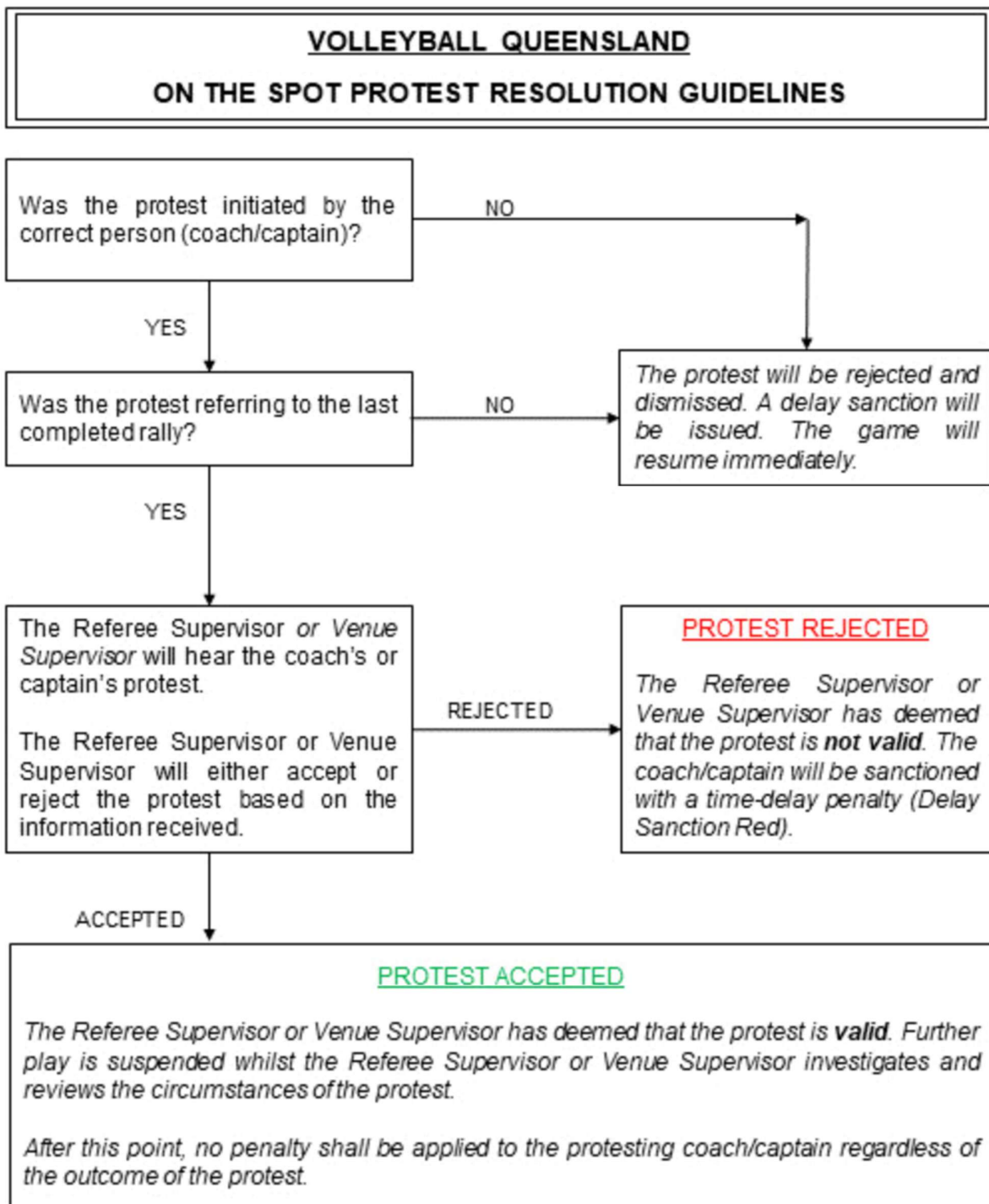
APPENDIX E – Top 8 List Definitions Diagram

ON THE SPOT PROTEST RESOLUTION GUIDELINES

INVESTIGATION

Where a protest has been accepted concerning a Referee's decision, the Referee Supervisor or Venue Supervisor will listen to the Duty Team Officials (First Referee/Second Referee/Scorer). The Duty Team Official(s) will provide the Referee Supervisor a summary of the events, and reasons of their decision concerning the application of the regulation.

In the case of a protest concerning the scorer's decision, the Referee Supervisor or Venue Supervisor and the First Referee will meet with the scorer to resolve the protest.

According to the rules in force, the Referee Supervisor decides to either :

- a. Uphold the First Referee's decision; or
- b. Overturn the First Referee's decision

UPHELD

OVERTURNED

DECISION UPHELD

*The Referee Supervisor or Venue Supervisor has deemed that the first referee's decision **was correct**, and the decision is **upheld**.*

The game is resumed after having applied the first referee's original decision.

DECISION OVERTURNED

*The Referee Supervisor or Venue Supervisor **overturns** the first referee's decision.*

The game is resumed from the point prior to the protest (previous rally cancelled).

PROTEST RESOLVED

*The Chief Referee or Venue Supervisor decision **is final and cannot be protested further** to any competition staff.*

APPENDIX I – Duty Team Requirements

The **duty team adult MUST be 18 years of age or older**, at the time of the match. They must remain with the duty team for the duration of the match and must wear the duty adult sash (so as to be clearly identifiable).

BEFORE THE MATCH:

- Ensure that coaches/captains have completed the following:
 - All players on court must be written in the team list complete with **full name** and playing jersey. The captain (and libero) must be identified.
- Ensure that all members are aware of their roles as part of the duty team
- Ensure that the scorer and scoresheet are filled out.

DURING THE MATCH:

- Ensure that the duty team members are well supported and performing their roles to a satisfactory standard
- Ensure that coaches of their team do not approach your duty team members
- Due to the nature of the competition and participation of junior officials the duty adult has the authority to:
 - Advise the officiating team of **clear and obvious faults**
 - Advise the officiating team on the issue of misconduct sanctions
 - *If you require assistance, please reach out to a member of the Venue Staff for assistance.*
- If an 'On-the-Spot Protest' occurs, please find a member of the Venue Staff for assistance.

AFTER THE MATCH:

- Ensure that all players that took court are listed on the team lists for either team.
- Ensure that the scoresheet is completed to the checklist/example (see right).

Requirements:

Under 15 Division	The duty adult should have an active role in the duty. They should be a member of the referee team (First Referee, Second Referee or Scorer)
Under 17 Division	The duty adult should have an active role in the duty. They should be a member of the referee team (First Referee, Second Referee or Scorer)
Under 19 Division	The duty adult should have a monitoring role in the duty. They should assist with the duties on the score bench, or second referee.

APPENDIX J – Affiliate Player Offers

Since 2025, Affiliates are required to ensure that all their offers to potential players are due by a certain date. These dates are known as ‘major offer deadlines’.

There are two Major Offer Deadlines in the 2026 Season:

- Major Offer Deadline 1: Friday, 5th March 2026 (11:59pm)
- Major Offer Deadline 2: Friday, 12th March 2026 (11:59pm)

Major Offer Deadline 1 – 5th March 2026

Affiliates are required to ensure that all their ‘first offers’ are both sent out before this date, and that players are to respond before this date.

- Affiliates may choose to set a deadline prior to the VQ Mandated Deadline
- All players who wish to participate in PVL must make their intentions clear to all Affiliates who have offered them a position. (Affiliates are to assume that if player intentions have not been given to an Affiliate to assume that the response is reject).
- *It is recommended that Affiliates create a clause in their acceptance that the athlete is financial liable for a state sum of club fees should they choose to withdraw after this point forwards.*

7 Day Recruitment Process

After Major Offer Deadline 1 has past, Affiliates have seven (7) days to recruit any additional players that have not already accepted their offers to another Affiliate.

Major Offer Deadline 2 – 12th March 2026

Affiliates are required to ensure that all their ‘final offers’ are both sent out before this date, and that players are to respond before this date.

- Affiliates may choose to set a deadline prior to the VQ Mandated Deadline
- All players who wish to participate in PVL must make their intentions clear to all Affiliates who have offered them a position. (Affiliates are to assume that if player intentions have not been given to an Affiliate to assume that the response is **reject**).

Offers Made After Major Offer Deadline 2

Affiliates may only make an offer to a player after major offer deadline 2 if:

1. The player in question has not accepted any offers to another Affiliate
2. The player in question is contractually released by the Affiliate to which they have already accepted an offer from.

Purpose and Enforcement of Major Offer Deadlines

The purpose of the Major Offer Deadlines is to aid Affiliates in determining the intention of players who have trial across multiple Affiliates. By setting a hard deadline on player intention, Affiliates can be more certain of their actual movements.

In order for the Offer Deadlines to work, all Affiliates **must act in Good Faith**. Volleyball Queensland however will enforce deadlines via mediation and arbitration. Should an Affiliate or Player be able to

provide evidence that an Affiliate or Player is in breach of the stipulated deadlines, VQ will begin an arbitration process.

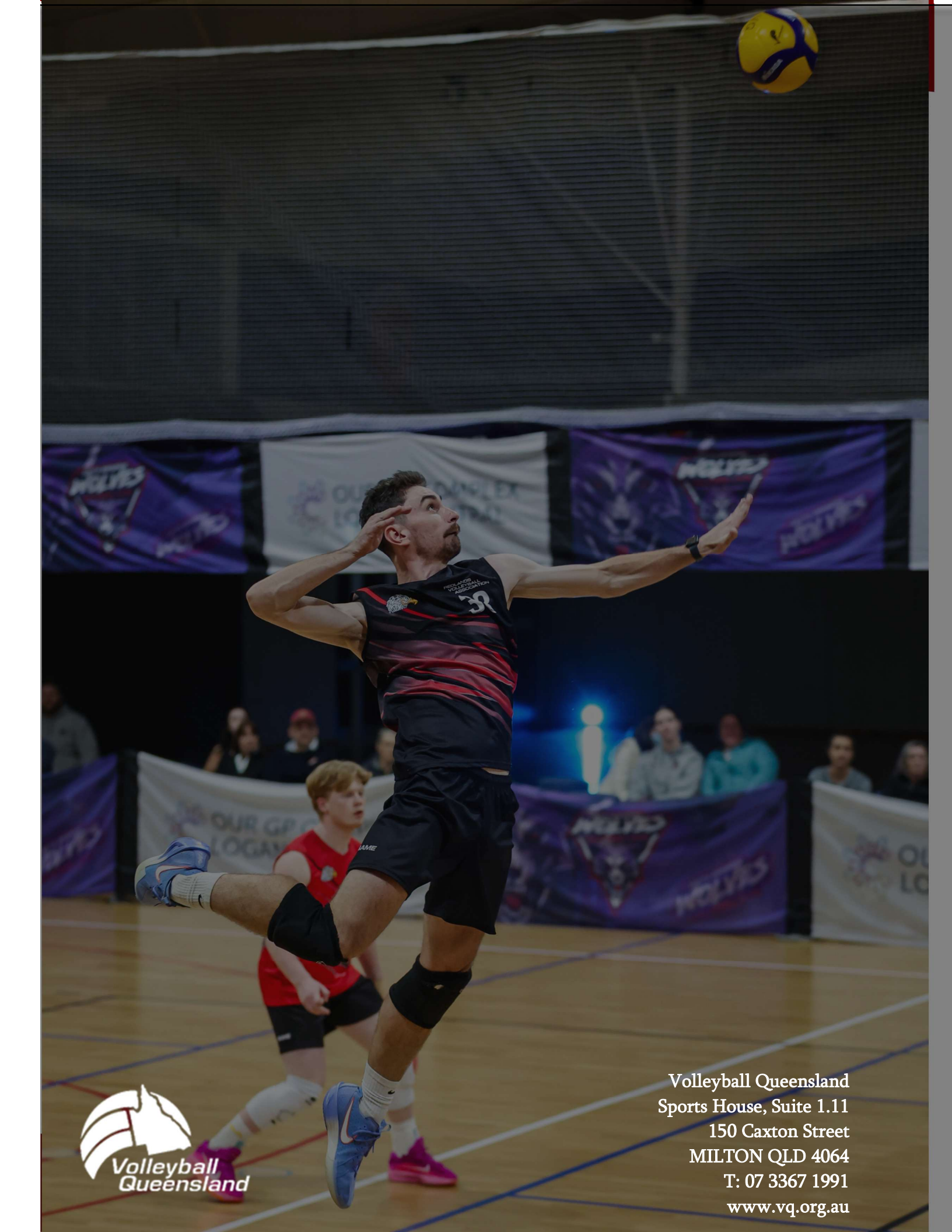
