Apex Volleyball Club Inc. 2025 Report

2025 was a standout year for Apex Volleyball Club, marked by success across multiple fronts. Building on a strong inaugural year in 2024, our focus in 2025 shifted toward consolidating and strengthening both our competitive and social programs. This effort culminated in the launch of our new Apex Training Roadmap, creating a clear and connected pathway for all players.

Competitions

In our second year competing in the Premier Volleyball League (PVL), Apex Volleyball Club was proudly represented by 93 players across nine teams, spanning Division 1, 2 and 3 Men's, Challenger Women's, and Division 1 and 2 Women's competitions. 2025 also marked our debut in Tier 1, with our Apex women entering the Challenger Division and finishing with a strong 7th place result in their first season at this level.

Building on a strong developmental year in 2024, the club focused on converting that foundation into competitive success. This was reflected in our results, with the Division 1 Men's Black team securing Silver, and the Division 1 Women's Black team claiming Bronze.

As always, the 2025 Queensland Seniors State Championships was the largest tournament of the year for Apex. The club fielded 10 teams and 90 players, including three Division 1 Men's teams, two Division 2 Men's teams, one Division 3 Men's team, three Division 1 Women's teams, and one Division 2 Women's team. It was an excellent weekend for the club, highlighted by a Bronze medal for the Division 1 Women's Gold team and a Silver medal for the Division 3 Men's team.

The Mid-Season Invitational (MSI) remained a valued Apex tradition in 2025, bringing together 70 players across 10 custom teams for an in-house competition weekend. In addition to these major events, Apex also competed in several external tournaments throughout the year, including VQ Metro League, Aces Cup, and BVC Seasonal Cups, returning home with multiple medals.

Overall, 2025 was an outstanding year of competition for Apex Volleyball Club, and we look forward to strengthening and expanding our competitive presence even further in the year ahead.

Social Roadmap

Apex's social training sessions have grown rapidly since their introduction in 2024, with weekly programs now offered across multiple skill levels: Beginners, Fundamentals, and Intermediates—the latter designed as a pre-PVL preparation pathway. Recognising a disconnect between our social training programs and the competitive arm of the club, we formally launched the Apex Training Roadmap, linking social training directly to PVL and other competitive opportunities. This created a clear, structured pathway where new players can enter at an appropriate level and progressively develop their skills, ultimately working toward PVL representation. The impact of this initiative has already been evident. We have seen significant improvement across our regular social training community, with several players now beginning to explore opportunities to represent Apex at the PVL level.



The 2026 Vision

Looking ahead to 2026, Apex Volleyball Club remains committed to fostering an inclusive, energetic, and supportive environment for the South Brisbane volleyball community. We aim to continue growing our presence, supported by our dedicated coaching staff and an expanding pool of competitive athletes. Alongside this, we will keep investing in our social programs, ensuring they remain welcoming, safe, and engaging spaces where players of all abilities can develop their skills and share a genuine passion for volleyball.

On behalf of Apex, I would like to express my sincere gratitude to everyone who contributed to the club throughout 2025 - our players, committee and subcommittee members, competitive and social coaches, social media team, volunteers, and supporters.

2025 saw a continued and rising interest in indoor volleyball across the Bundaberg region. We held our first ever BDVA Awards night which saw players awarded Most Improved, Players Player and Team Spirit Awards. Participation in these competitions and an increased push to advertise the Berserkers Representative program has resulted in an enormous increase in interest regarding our 2026 trials. This eventuated in over 80 players trialling for our men's and women's squad, which was narrowed down to two teams of 18 by our committee selectors. We are excited for these teams to get out and give it all they've got in as many competitions as we can in 2026.

President's Report

Introduction

It's been another remarkable year for Cairns Volleyball Association. After years of focusing on membership growth, 2024/2025 has seen a shift toward elevating the quality of our indoor competition. With increased membership came a wave of talented players, allowing us to diversify and raise the standard of offerings across all levels.

I'm proud to say this year's committee has been one of the most collaborative and supportive I've worked with. Their shared commitment and communal spirit have made stepping down as President a guilt-free decision. CVA is in excellent hands, and I'll continue to support the new committee.

Membership & Competition Development

- Indoor Competition: The rise in playing standards has created a gap between recreational players and those seeking high-level competition. To support this higher standard we reintroduced nominated referees—after nearly a decade of relying on team volunteers. This move has significantly improved match quality. Special thanks to Will Weston and Stephen Ung for leading this initiative.
- Division 2: Plans are underway to develop a Division 2 competition to support emerging players. The challenge remains in sourcing suitable convenors to manage this expansion.

Thursday Development Program

- Under John's leadership, our 'Learn to Play' program has remained strong. However, a wide range of skill levels led to the creation of 'C Grade' to accommodate intermediate players. Despite this, a gap still exists between C Grade and Division 1/2, so Thursday nights will continue focusing on fundamental skill development.
- Participation has surged from 45 to over 60 players this term, with two time slots already full and a third likely to be added soon.
- *Congratulations to John and Amber on the new addition to their family! While John was on parental leave, I had the pleasure of stepping in to support the program.*

Pathways to Representation

- The Thursday program has proven its value, with many players progressing to represent Cairns at the QLD Junior State Championships. It's not just about competition—it's about fostering passion and connection to the sport.
- Thank you to Kirsty Soda for her continued dedication to the women's representative program.
- Under Brian Geck's guidance, the men's program returned with strength, sending two teams away this year.
- At the Junior State Championships:
 - U19 Girls earned Silver under coach Natalie Ung.
 - U17 Boys & Girls and U19 Boys all placed 6th in divisions of up to 18 teams.

- **Jesse (Secretary):** Please join me in thanking Jesse for his tireless work—handling Fair Play vouchers, launching programs, sourcing venues, and co-running Wednesday nights with Nat.
- **Cairns Cup:** The event has outgrown its city facility model. Last year’s dual-venue format required more coordination, so this year we’re moving to Edmonton. This will allow all divisions to compete together and expand the men’s competition to two divisions.

CREADAPTIC VOLLEYBALL CLUB 2025/26 VOLLEYBALL QUEENSLAND **ANNUAL REPORT**

For Creadaptic Volleyball Club (CVC), 2025 was defined by a powerful duality: **record-breaking growth met with aggressive internal refinement.**

We operate on a singular, non-negotiable principle: **We never lose; we either win or we learn.**

This past year provided invaluable learning wins that allowed us to stress-test our organisational systems, refine our internal culture, and reinforce our structural foundation. We emerged from 2025 doubling down on our vision, becoming a more streamlined, disciplined, and high-performance-oriented organisation than ever before. This relentless pursuit of refinement is the very lifeblood of CVC. It secures the long-term integrity of our club and our continued contribution to the sport in Queensland.

The 2025 season acted as a deliberate forge for our identity. We utilised every moment of friction to reinforce our foundation, making the necessary strategic calls to ensure every element of our club aligns with our trajectory. In doing so, we intentionally chose temporary disruption over the far more dangerous risk of permanent misalignment. This critical course-correction was made possible by an understanding and resilient membership base, whose loyalty allowed us to lay a proper, unbreakable foundation for the future. The size of our club also afforded us the agility necessary to navigate these complex shifts with speed and precision. At CVC, we will protect our long-term vision with the highest priority, even when it demands the "right calls" that result in short-term volatility.

CVC is built exclusively for the "**audacious few**" – those fuelled by a relentless passion for the game and an obsession with competitive excellence, accountability, and discipline. In 2025, we recorded the highest level of interest in our club's history, with over 130 players trailing for our competitive squads. This surge in demand was a direct byproduct of our dominant performance at the 2024 Senior State Championships (SSC), where our Men's Division 1 team secured Gold, complemented by powerful showings across our entire club. Further, we achieved a definitive milestone by fielding our first-ever Women's PVL team, a long-term strategic objective for the club. This achievement was the culmination of deliberate planning and a commitment to dismantle participation barriers for female athletes. To support this growth and ensure our athletes were prepared for the rigors of the league, CVC made the proactive decision to fully subsidise the participation costs for our Women's Division 2 team at the 2024 SSC. This strategic investment was designed to immerse our athletes in the "club land" ecosystem and provide them with high-level competitive exposure.

We believe in looking after the athletes who form the backbone of our culture. In 2025, our returning PVL players received a performance package worth over \$450 each. This elite suite featured carbon-fiber VKTRY insoles to help with explosiveness and injury prevention, and an all-in-one pre-workout tub to fuel those heavy training sessions. We also included a 10% loyalty discount on memberships as a direct reinvestment in our most committed athletes.

Our ability to handle major, professional-grade events was on full display through our partnership with Domino's Australia. We delivered a beach-bash style volleyball event for the 2025 Domino's Rally, an annual celebration that brought together roughly 1,500 attendees from Australia, New Zealand, and the U.S.. CVC had its own designated area right alongside Red Bull, proving that we can bridge the gap between our sport and global corporate brands while creating massive visibility for our club.



We believe that elite output requires an elite setup, and in 2025, we also took aggressive, massive steps to professionalise our training standards to match the scale of our ambitions. A defining win was successfully securing a major grant, which allowed us to bring professional-grade training equipment directly onto the court. This investment ensures our athletes are training with the same high-level technology and equipment utilised by professional sporting organisations globally, and provides them with every technical edge necessary to reach their absolute potential. Furthermore, our successful Bunnings fundraiser also generated the vital capital required to strengthen our core internal support programs: CVC Talent, Protect, Assist, and Aid. These four pillars are what ensure a CVC athlete is the most supported player in the state, and provides the long-term stability needed for our athletes to truly thrive.

As we look toward 2026, we do so from a position of absolute strength. Our focus is razor-sharp. We live by a simple, dangerous belief: greatness and contentment cannot coexist. We are allergic to "good enough." We've built a specialised home for those obsessed with excellence, and we pour our resources exactly where they belong – on the athletes who embody our values.

We have massive things in store for 2026.

Club Overview

Growth outlook

In addition to indoor volleyball programs, the club also delivers beach volleyball development opportunities in partnership with Strathpine Indoor Sports, providing athletes with opportunities to develop their skills across both formats of the game.

Our athletes are also increasingly active within the broader Queensland volleyball pathway, with players competing on the QBVT across both youth and senior divisions.

Athlete Development

A key focus of the club continues to be player development and youth pathways. The strong participation of junior athletes across PVL teams demonstrates the success of our development programs. Many of our youth athletes are now progressing into adult divisions, strengthening the depth of our senior teams and creating a natural pathway within the club.

2025 saw continued development in the cultural shift, program focus, and overall direction that our club has been working towards over the past several years. Our junior program continued to grow, with the junior representative program sending a record five teams to the 2025 VQ Junior State Championships. This represented a squad of approximately 50 athletes from Mackay to Townsville, who were given the opportunity to train consistently over a three-month period leading into the competition on the Gold Coast. This pathway continues to provide valuable opportunities for junior athletes to transition into our senior representative programs.

Our local mixed social competitions remained stable throughout the year, providing members with weekly opportunities to play 6v6 mixed volleyball in both A Grade and B Grade competitions. The Monsoons Beach League, operating out of the James Cook University Townsville beach volleyball courts, continued to grow and expanded to two full nights of fixtures, offering mixed, men's, and women's doubles, as well as four-a-side beach volleyball.

Once again, our major indoor tournaments formed a cornerstone of the club's competitive calendar. Across five tournaments engaging schools, junior athletes, and senior athletes, we welcomed approximately 800 athletes, coaches, officials, and supporters to the region. We also hosted the Townsville round of the Great Barrier Reef Challenge in collaboration with beach volleyball centres in Mackay and Rockhampton. In addition to this major event, two smaller one-day beach volleyball tournaments were delivered successfully and provided valuable insight into future planning to expand tournament opportunities for our beach athletes.

This year also saw the addition of B.A.L.A Academy as a friend to Townsville Monsoons Volleyball and a new face in the Townsville volleyball community. Following previous years of low engagement in weekend training sessions which led to the club discontinuing that program, B.A.L.A has filled an important gap in our development pathway. This has created a collaborative relationship in which Monsoons continues to provide leagues, tournaments, and official representative club pathways, while B.A.L.A delivers regular, high-quality training opportunities for athletes.

At the last AGM, the committee developed a set of goals centred on improving connections with schools and increasing engagement with school-aged athletes. While this remains an ongoing focus, a significant achievement in 2025 was the successful delivery of the North Queensland Volleyball Schools Cup, which provided school-aged athletes from Far North Queensland to Mackay the opportunity to participate in a structured tournament in the region.

We were very grateful for the continued support of our long-standing sponsor PaediaTricks Occupational Therapy throughout 2025, as well as the addition of our new sponsor, Evolution IT, which entered a three-year partnership with the club. We sincerely thank both organisations for their support, which plays a vital role in enabling us to provide equitable, high-quality volleyball opportunities across North Queensland.
